Award

1. Vide SRO-14 dated 20th January, 2003, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir, on being satisfied over the existence of an industrial dispute between the parties, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (C) of sub-section (1) of section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (XIV of 1947), has referred the dispute to this tribunal for adjudication in respect of the following matters :-

- (a) Legality or otherwise of the action of the management of M/s Manu Mohit Industries, Dhiani, Samba, in terminating the services of its employee, Shri Sukhwant Singh, Foreman ; and
- (b) Award appropriate relief to the said employee in case the illegality of the action of the management of the said industry is established.

2. On notice both the parties filed their respective claims.

3. The petitioner has pleaded that his services were terminated arbitrarily, wrongfully and illegally on 27-04-2002 and his date of appointment is 11-10-1993.

4. That he was working as a foreman and drawing Rs. 4200/- per month at the time of his illegal termination from service.

5. That juniors to him still continue to be in service.

6. That the management never gave him any casual leave, earned leave, medical leave or other holidays throughout his service period.

7. That the management never issued him any notice for any fault on his part and failed to adopt procedure as laid down in law.

8. That the workman approached the management, number of times, but the management refused to take him back.

9. That, left with no alternative, the workman approached the Asstt. Labour Commissioner, Jammu for his re-instatement, but of no avail.

10. And finally prayed that the petitioner requested to get the workman re-instated at his old job, with full back wages and continuity of service with all other consequential benefits.

11. The respondent filed objections on 09-06-2003 averring therein—

- (i) That conduct of an employee is of paramount consideration for an employer for the retention of an employee on the job. It is submitted that the employer herein had lost confidence in the employee for his grave acts of misconduct, indiscipline, deliberate financial loss, mishandling of costly machinery by applicant in as much as due to deliberate acts of applicant, the respondent had suffered a financial loss of nearly three lacs because wooden screws manufactured by workman had to be dumped in waste being below the standard norms and inferior product could not be sold in the market ;
- (ii) That in the entire body of claim petition, the applicant workman is projecting his case in manner that it is only the workman who is granted protection under labour laws and the employer has to watch every excess, every act of indiscipline, misconduct etc. of an employee as a silent spectator. It is necessary to submit that on an earlier occasion the services of applicant were terminated but due to intervention of Labour Deptt. authorities, he was retained on the job but due to continued acts of misconduct omitted by applicant, the respondent was constrained to terminate the services of the applicant because

no private entrepreneur can afford to bear immense loss due acts of a particular individual. The applicant claims himself to be union leader and as such was creating chaotic conditions, using abusive language indulging other co-workers to abstain from work, forced the employer to take this extreme step. The claim petition as such is not maintainable and deserves outright dismissal.

- (iii) That every employee has to act with a sense of discipline and decorum and since both the essential elements were lacking the services of applicant had to be dispensed with.
- (iv) Since the retention of applicant had become dangerous to the working of unit, the services of applicant were dispensed with because no employer can be forced to retain an employee the conduct of whom is harmful to the employer.
- (v) So far as it relates to the factum of alleged illegal termination. The applicant is himself responsible for causing loss to the employer to the extent of nearly rupees three lacs due to deliberate mishandling of costly machinery, producing inferior products beside creating sense of indiscipline, chaotic conditions in the working of unit and loss of confidence.
- (vi) Whatever leave or other holidays are permissible under rules were allowed to applicant while he was in service.
- (vii) Termination order itself depicts reasons with regard to loss of confidence, creating chaotic conditions, indiscipline and loss to employer as also other acts mentioned therein are sufficient to cause termination of applicant. Prayer is made for rejection of the claim of the petitioner.

12. Rejoinder was filed to statement of claim of the workman wherein the contents of the written statement were generally denied and the contents of the claim were reiterated.

13. The points of reference were treated as the issues and the parties were directed to lead evidence in support of their pleadings.

14. The evidence of the petitioner was closed on 04-04-2005 and thereafter respondent was directed to lead the evidence. After availing numerous opportunities to lead the evidence, only one witness namely Ram Murti was recorded on 22-10-2007 besides the proprietor.

15. Thereafter respondent remained absent and on his continuance absence from the proceedings, *ex parte* proceedings were initiated and *ex parte* award was passed on 13-10-2008.

16. The *ex parte* award was set asided on 04-07-2011 and was kept for the evidence of the respondent. Since 21-07-2011 till 17-02-2014 none of the witnesses was produced by the respondent. At the request of the Ld. Counsel for the respondent, the evidence of the respondent was closed and file was kept for arguments.

17. Heard arguments and gone through the file. My issue-wise findings are under :-

Issue No. 1 :-

The evidence lead by the petitioner has proved that the petitioner was employed with the respondent as a Foreman (Mechanic) for the preparation of new wooden screw etc. He was getting Rs. 3500/- P. M. The petitioner was terminated in 2002. There was a strike in the factory and during the negotiation between the management and the workers union it was agreed that the demands of the workers will be settled and in this regard a SRO will be issued. Since the petitioner was the Vice-President of the union and despite the call off of the strike he was not allowed to join his duty. At the time of his termination, no notice was given to him nor any inquiry was conducted. It is further stated by the evidence that the plant/unit of the respondent failed due to old machinery.

18. The evidence lead by the respondent has stated that the petitioner was engaged as foreman but not a workman, for looking after the machine

of screw. Petitioner was provided training for the manufacturing of the screws. Without seeking any instructions of the management, petitioner tried to modify the machines of the factory and due to his mishandling the machines were stopped and become non-functional. The petitioner used to come in the factory after taking liquor and under the influence of the liquor he used to quarrel with other workers of the factory. Even the owner of the factory and his father were abused and misbehaved by him. The petitioner was issued notice through registered envelop notice but the petitioner did not received the same.

19. The employment of the petitioner has been admitted by the respondent but as a foreman and not a workman. So the question comes whether the petitioner is a workman. Before proceeding further let us go through the definition of a workman under the Industrial Disputes Act.

Section 2 (s) defines a "Workman" as—

Any person (including an apprentice) employed in any industry to do any manual, unskilled, technical, operational, clerical or supervisory work for hire or reward, whether the terms of employment be expressed or implied, and for the purpose of any proceeding under this Act in relation to an industrial dispute, includes any such person who has been dismissed, discharged or retrenched in connection with, or as a consequence of, that dispute, or whose dismissal, discharge or retrenchment has led to that dispute, but does not include any such person—

- (i) who is subject to the Air Force Act, 1950 (45 of 1950), or the Army Act, 1950 (46 of 1950), or the Navy Act, 1957 (62 of 1957); or
- (ii) who is employed in the police service or as an officer or other employee of a prison ; or
- (iii) who is employed mainly in a managerial or administrative capacity ; or

- (iv) who, being employed in a supervisory capacity, draws wages exceeding one thousand six hundred rupees per mensem or exercises, either by nature of duties attached to the office or by reason of the powers vested in him, functions mainly of a managerial nature.

20. From the perusal of the above said provisions of section 2 (S) Clause III and IV, it is crystal clear that the provisions of I. D. Act are applicable to the workman and not the persons who are being employed as on a managerial or administrative capacity and the persons who are getting wages exceeding Rs. 1600/- (One thousand six hundred) per mensem.

21. In the present case the petitioner is a foreman who is skilled person and was working himself in the factory as per the evidence oral as well as documentary on record no doubt the petitioner was getting wages more than the ceiling amount of Rs. 1600/- per mensem but the salary of the employee is not the only criteria for determining the status of a workman but the nature of work performed by the workman is to be kept in mind. I place my reliance on a judgement published as 2001 LRR 378. Since the petitioner was not working in a managerial capacity, so he does fall within the definition of workman in view of section 2 clause S.

22. Now the question arises, whether the petitioner has been terminated in accordance with the labour laws and common laws. In this regards the petitioner has alleged that no notice or any enquiry was conducted by the respondent while terminating the services of the petitioner. It is admitted by the respondent that there was a strike in the factory and the petitioner was the instrument. It is also pleaded by the respondent that the petitioner was a drunkard and used to misbehave with the workers and the respondent including his father also. So far as the misconduct and drunkardness of the petitioner is concerned, there is nothing on record which could prove that any police report was lodged with the concerned agency. The petitioner may be an arrogant person and indiscipline person and was a liability for the respondent but still he should be terminated and ousted as per the procedure laid down. In this regard the evidence lead by the respondent is not sufficient to construe that any inquiry was conducted against the petitioner. The respondent has not

provided any compensation to the petitioner before his termination. It is imperative for the petitioner to prove the conduct of the petitioner and the release of compensation along with other benefits to the petitioner while terminating him. Perusal of the record reveals that one registered envelop along with an AD form was issued to the petitioner and there is an endorsement made by the petitioner as "Gair Qanooni Notice" it means that the petitioner was fully aware of the proceedings and the notice issued to him. The petitioner has himself refused to accept the notice of the respondent, so the question of non-issuance of notice to the petitioner does not arise. There is a notification/SRO-220 dated 04-07-2003 which reads that "the strike shall be called off and the work in the factory be resumed w. e. f. 17-06-2002 and the workers shall be paid one month wages in advance. Two retrenched workers shall not be taken back till the conciliation process is complete. The management was held liable for the breach of settlement between the parties and a recommendation was made for the prosecution of the management.

24. No doubt the management has a tool to oust to the worker but before that, provisions of section 25-F of I. D. Act are to be complied with. There is nothing on record to prove that petitioner was given any compensation while terminating him. It is for the respondent to prove that the petitioner was terminated after complying the statutory provisions under the labour laws. No documentary proof has been lead by the respondent for granting or releasing the compensation to the petitioner. In brief the petitioner was terminated during his service without adopting due course of law. It has also come in the oral as well the documentary evidence that there was a strike in the respondent factory w. e. f. 18-04-2002 to 15-06-2002. It appears that the petitioner has been terminated because of *mala fide* intention and with ulterior motive.

25. In 2003 LLR 136 Hon'ble Allahabad High Court in a case titled, BCM Ltd. V/s. State of UP and Ors.-

"U. P. Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, Section 2 (s) and 6N, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, Section 25-F, Retrenchment,

striking off the name of the workman from the rolls constitutes retrenchment conditions precedent for a valid termination as contemplated by section 6N or 25-F of Central Act not complied with Labour Court, rightly held that termination of service amounted to illegal retrenchment was not gainfully employed-Awarded full back wages.”

26. It is well settled law that the onus of proof lies upon the person who assert the existence of any fact. As stated above, the management has not lead any evidence to prove that the enquiry was conducted.

27. In a case M/s Nicks (India) Tools Vs. Ram Surat and Anr. (Supra), Hon'ble Supreme Court has, *inter alia*, held as under :-

“Since the respondent workman was in the service of the appellant management.....the burden of proving that he voluntarily left the services then falls on appellant management.”

28. In another case of Shri Shiv Kumar Vs. Hansita, Hon'ble High Court has held as under :-

“It is a settled position that the abandonment of service cannot be readily inferred. Abandonment of service is a question of intention which can be gathered from the totality of the facts and circumstances of each case. There has to be a clear evidence on record to show that despite grant of reasonable opportunity to the employee by the management, he failed to join back his duties without any sufficient reasons and therefore in the absence of any such cogent and convincing evidence, voluntarily abandonment on the part of the employee cannot be readily inferred.....”

29. Coming to the present matter, undisputedly it is admitted fact that the workman was employee of the management. Hence, in the light of above judgment the burden to prove that the workman left the service voluntarily lie upon the management.

30. Considering the entire facts and circumstances, it is found that the management has failed to bring on record any cogent or consistent verbal or documentary evidence to prove that the workman has abandoned his service voluntarily.

31. Before proceedings ahead here it is necessary to reproduce the relevant provision of Section 25-F of Industrial Dispute Act, which are as under :-

Section 25-F. Condition precedent to retrenchment of workman.
No workman employed in any industry who has been in continuous service of not less than one year under an employer shall be retrenched by that employer until –

- (a) the workman has been given one month's notice in writing indicating the reasons for retrenchment and the period of notice has expired, or the workman has been paid in lieu of such notice, wages for the period of the notice.
- (b) the workman has been paid, at the time of retrenchment, compensation which shall be equivalent to fifteen days' average pay (for every completed year of continuous service) or any part thereof in excess of six months.

32. From bare perusal of section 25-F, it is found that the workman who has completed 240 days in the year preceding his termination cannot be retrenched without giving one month notice and notice pay etc.

33. The reliance is also placed on case Ramesh Kumar Vs. State of Haryana, 2010 (1) LLJ 821 SC, wherein, Hon'ble Supreme Court has held that once the workman has completed 240 days the workman cannot be terminated without notice.

34. In view of the above discussions it is held that the termination of the services of the petitioner by the respondent was illegal and deserves to

be set aside. Accordingly the termination of the petitioner is set aside. This issue is decided in favour of the petitioner and against the respondent.

Issue No. 2 :

35. Since the termination of the petitioner has been proved illegal on the part of the management. The second question comes for consideration to what extent the petitioner is entitled to the relief.

36. Though in the ordinary cases, Labour Courts do awards reinstatement of the petitioners, however, the recent trend of the superior courts has been towards for compensation instead of reinstatement. Reliance is placed on 2009 LLR 1 SC. U. P. State Electricity Board Vs. Laxmi Kant Gupta, 2009 871 SC, Narendra Kumar Vs. The Regional Manager, Punjab National Bank and Ors., 2009 LLR 966 SC Jagbir Singh Vs. Haryana State Agriculture Marketing Board and Anr., 2008 LLR 555 SC Gaziabad Development Authority and Anr. Vs. Ashok Kumar and Anr. and 2009 LLR 1281 SC Ashok Kumar Shrama Vs. Oberoi Flight Services. It was held that reinstatement is an exception and normally that court must give a lump-sum amount towards compensation instead of a reinstatement.

37. In the present matter, admittedly, the termination of the workman amounts to illegal termination. Once it is held that the termination was illegal, the workman was entitled for legal benefits.

38. In the present matter the management is a private concern and has been closed, therefore it would not be appropriate to make order for reinstatement and lump-sum compensation may be paid to the workman. The workman has not proved about his unemployment from the date of his termination. It was for the petitioner to prove that he has remained unemployed.

39. Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case and to meet the ends of the justice, it would be appropriate to award lump-sum compensation of Rs. 1,00,000,- (Rs. One Lac only) in lieu of reinstatement and back wages to the workman. Hence, management is directed to pay lump-sum compensation of Rs. 1,00,000/- to the workman.

40. The reference is answered accordingly and be sen' to the appropriate Government for further necessary action. File to go to records under rules.

No. HUD/Adm/50/2010 dated 05-09-2014, "the Srinagar Municipal Corporation Class-IV Services (Special Provision) Regulations, 2014" are hereby notified and appended herewith.

These regulations shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette.

SRINAGAR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION
CLASS-IV SERVICE (SPECIAL PROVISIONS)
REGULATIONS, 2014.

Regulations to provide for regularization of Municipal Corporation employees appointed on *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated basis.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 67 read with section 394 of the Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Corporation Act, 2000, the Corporation with the prior approval of the Government hereby makes the following regulations to provide for regularization of the employees appointed on *Ad hoc*, Contractual or Consolidated basis.

1. *Short title and commencement.*—(1) These regulations may be called the Srinagar Municipal Corporation Class-IV Services (Special Provision) Regulations, 2014.

(2) These shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette.

2. *Definitions.*—In these regulations unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or the context,—

(a) "Act" means the Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 ;

(b) "Appointed day" means 1st of January, 2014 ;

- (c) "Competent Authority" means the authority competent to make appointment under section 67 of the Act ;
- (d) "Consolidated appointee." means a person who has been appointed against any post under the Corporation on consolidated monthly salary/wages ;
- (e) "Contractual appointee" means a person who has been appointed on contract basis against any post under the Corporation ;
- (f) "*Ad hoc* appointee" means a person appointed on *ad hoc* basis against any post on need basis ;
- (g) "Government" means the Government of Jammu and Kashmir ;
- (h) "Post" means a post borne on the establishment of the Corporation in the cadre of Class-IV categories like peons, orderlies, farash, safaiwallas, mushkies, summon server, sampler, workshop helper, chowkidar, gardener, boatmen, slaughter house worker, cattle catcher, cleaner and similar posts created by the Competent Authority from time to time on need basis ;
- (i) "Empowered Committee" means the Empowered Committee constituted under sub-section (1) of regulation 10.
- (j) "Regularized employee" means a person whose services are regularized under regulation 10 (5) ;
- (k) "Corporation" means Srinagar Municipal Corporation ;
- (l) "Recruiting Agency" means the authority competent to make selection for appointment to any substantive post or service under the Corporation.

3. *Application of the Regulation* —These Regulations shall apply to Safaiwallas and Class-IV posts under the Corporation as are held by any person having been appointed on *ad hoc*, contractual basis including those

appointed on consolidated salary/wages ; provided that such appointments have been made by the Competent Authority on need basis but shall not apply to—

- (a) Persons appointed on tenure posts co-terminus with the life of the project or scheme of the State or Central Government, as the case may be ;
- (b) Part-time or seasonal employees.

*Explanation to Rule (3) :—*Provided that only Safaiwalla and Class-IV posts shall be utilized for purpose of adjustment/regularization of the consolidated workers engaged from time to time and having completed seven years of continuous service.

*4. Exclusion from the purview of recruiting agencies.—*Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any other rule/regulation for the time being in force, the posts referred to under section 3 shall be and shall always be, deemed to have been excluded from the purview of the recruiting agencies.

*5. Regularization of contractual, consolidated and ad hoc appointee.—*Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any rule/regulations for the time being in force, the *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated appointees shall be regularized on the fulfillment of the following conditions :—

- (i) That he has been appointed/engaged as consolidated/*ad hoc*/contractual worker by the Competent Authority on need basis ;
- (ii) That he continues as such on the appointed day ;
- (iii) That he possessed the requisite qualifications and eligibility for the post on the day of his initial appointment on contractual, or consolidated basis as prescribed under the recruitment rules governing the service or post ;
- (iv) That no disciplinary or criminal proceedings are pending against him on the appointed day ; and

(v) That he has completed seven years of continuous service as such on the appointed day ;

(vi) Regularization shall be done against clear vacant post :

Provided that the regularization of the eligible *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated employees under these regulations shall have effect only from the date of such regularization irrespective of the fact that such appointees have completed more than seven years of service on the appointed day or thereafter but before such regularization :

Provided further that any contractual or consolidated appointee who is in-service but who has not completed seven years of service on the appointed day shall continue as such till completion of seven years and shall thereafter be entitled to regularization under these regulations.

6. *Relaxation in upper age limit.*—(1) The upper age limit as prescribed under rules for entry into Corporation service shall be relaxed, by the Minister Incharge Housing and Urban Development Department, in case the *ad hoc*, consolidated or contractual appointee is otherwise eligible for regularization under these regulations provided such appointee has crossed the age limit at the time of his regularization but was within the prescribed age for appointment/engagement at the time of his initial appointment as such or his age was relaxed by the Competent Authority at the time of his initial appointment/engagement.

(2) The *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated appointee shall be treated as an in-service candidate so far as the upper age limit is concerned for direct recruitment to Corporation service :

Provided his *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated service is subsisting on the day of issue of the advertisement notification or at the time of consideration of their regularization by the Competent Authority under these regulations.

7. *Fixation of pay.*—Every regularised employee shall from the date of his regularization be entitled to fixation of pay in the time scale of pay applicable to the Safaiwalla/Class-IV post against which he is regularized.

8. *Test or training.*—Wherever any test or training is prescribed as a qualification for declaration of completion of probation in a service the regularized employee shall pass such test or undergo such training within one year from the appointed day, failing which his annual increments shall be stopped and if he fails to pass such test or undergo such training even by the end of the fourth year from the date of his regularization, his services shall be terminated.

9. *Seniority.*—The seniority of the regularized employee shall be determined with reference to the date of his regularization :

Provided that the inter-se seniority of the regularized employee shall be determined with reference to the date of their initial appointments on *ad hoc* or contractual or consolidated basis, as the case may be, subject to the merit/select list, if any :

Provided further that if the date of initial appointment on *ad hoc* or contractual or consolidated basis of two or more employees is same, then an employee older in age shall rank senior to an employee younger in age subject to merit/select list, if any.

10. *Empowered Committee.*—(1) There shall be an Empowered Committee consisting of,—

(2) The Divisions, Branches, Sections of the Corporation shall within 60 days from the commencement of these Regulations, refer all the cases

of eligible *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated appointees for regularization under these regulations to the Member-Secretary for being placed before the Empowered Committee for scrutiny and verification with regard to their entitlement to regularization under these regulations.

(3) The Empowered Committee shall examine such cases and notify the names of such *ad hoc*, contractual or consolidated employees who have been found eligible for regularization under these regulations in respect of each wing of SMC within 15 days period for filing of objections before the committee.

(4) The Empowered Committee shall thereafter examine the complaints, if any, received and make appropriate recommendations to the Competent Authority with regard to administrative approval for regularization in respect of each case on fulfillment of the conditions specified under these regulations or rejection of the case.

(5) The Competent Authority on the recommendations of Empowered Committee shall consider and accord approval for regularization.

11. *Appeal*.—(1) Any person aggrieved of the recommendations made by the Empowered Committee on account of being left-out may prefer an appeal within 30 days from the date of recommendations by the Empowered Committee before the Administrative Secretary, Housing and Urban Development Department.

(2) The Appellate Authority may, after hearing the appellant and after seeking comments from the Empowered Committee pass appropriate orders in this behalf which shall be final and conclusive.

12. *Penalty*.—(1) In case it is found that the regularized employee has secured appointment or regularization on the basis of a forged, fake or fabricated document/certificate, his regularization or appointment shall be cancelled by the Competent Authority.

(2) In case any officer or official fabricates or forges any document to give undue advantage to any person in the matter of regularization or aids or abets any person to secure any fabricated or forged document to

claim regularization under these regulations he shall be liable for disciplinary proceedings and the salary drawn by such regularized employee shall be recoverable from such defaulting officer or official as arrears of land revenue.

13. *Restriction on further ad hoc, contractual or consolidated appointments.*—With effect from the commencement of these regulations, no appointment shall be made by the Corporation on *ad hoc*, contractual, consolidated or temporary basis and all the vacant posts shall be filled up strictly in accordance with the rules governing the recruitment to the respective services or post. However, in case of further expansion of Municipal Limits from time to time as per functions of the Corporation and in case of special circumstances, the Corporation with prior approval of the Government can engage such persons on need basis if they possess the prescribed eligibility criteria.

14. *Interpretation.*—if any question arises relating to the interpretation of these rules, the matter shall be referred to the Government whose decision thereon shall be final.

The same is therefore, being published for information of general public for inviting objections, as required under section 115 of the aforesaid Act.

Objections, if any, shall be submitted to the Commissioner/Secretary to Government, Labour and Employment Department within 45 days from the date of publications of this notification, whereafter no objections shall be entertained.

Schedule XIV-Handling and processing of asbestos, manufacture of any article of substance of asbestos and any other processes of manufacture or otherwise in which asbestos is used in any form

(Model Factories Rules, 120 (MFR 120) under section 87)

1. *Application.*—(1) This schedule shall apply to all manufacturing process as defined under section 2(k) of the Act, carried on in a factory involving exposure of workers to asbestos and/or product containing asbestos.

(2) The Government may, at any time, for the purpose of giving effect to any scientific proof obtained from specialized institutions or experts in the field, notification in the Official Gazette, make suitable changes in the said schedule.

(3) The provisions of this schedule shall apply to all workers exposed to asbestos in the factory and it shall be the responsibility of the occupier of the factory to comply with the provisions of the schedule in respect of the workers.

- (4) (a) The occupier of the factory wherein asbestos or substances containing asbestos are in use, shall prepare work procedures and practices, in the light of scientific research and technological progress for approval by the Chief Inspector and shall follow only such approved procedures.
- (b) Notwithstanding anything mentioned in sub-paragraph (1) use of asbestos is prohibited in the manufacturing process as may be notified by the Government in this behalf.
- (c) (i) spraying of all forms of asbestos is prohibited in a factory ;
- (ii) The prohibition in respect of spraying of asbestos referred to in sub-para (i) may be exempted by the

Chief Inspector if the occupier represents that such spraying is inevitable certain purposes provided adequate measures for ensuring the safety and health of workers are undertaken by the occupier to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector.

2. *Definition.*—For the purpose of this Schedule—

- (a) “asbestos” means any fibrous silicate mineral and any admixture containing action lite, amosite, anthophyllite, chrysotile, crocidolite, tremolite or any mixture thereof, whether crude, crushed or opened ;
- (b) “asbestos textiles” means yarn or clothes composed of asbestos or asbestos mixed with any other materials ;
- (c) “approved” means approved for the time being in writing by the Chief Inspector ;
- (d) “breathing apparatus” means a helmet or face piece with necessary connection by means of which a person using it breathes air free from dust, or any other approved apparatus ;
- (e) “efficient exhaust draught” means a localized ventilation by mechanical means for the removal of dust so as to prevent dust from escaping into air of any place in which work is carried on. No draught shall be deemed to be efficient which fails to control dust produced at the point where such dust originates ;
- (f) “preparing” means crushing, disintegrating, and any other processes in or incidental to the opening of asbestos ;
- (g) “protective clothing” means airborne particles of asbestos or settled particles of asbestos which are liable to become airborne in the factory ;
- (h) “asbestos dust” means airborne particles of asbestos or settled particles of asbestos which are liable to become airborne in the factory ;

- (i) "airborne asbestos dust" means, for the purposes of measurement, dust particles measured by gravimetric assessment or other equivalent method ;
- (j) "repairable asbestos fibres" means asbestos fibres having diameter of less than 3 micrometre and a length to diameter ratio greater than 3:1 ;
- (k) "exposure to asbestos" means exposure to airborne repairable asbestos fibres or asbestos dust ; whether originating from asbestos or from minerals, materials or products containing asbestos in the factory.

2-A. *Demolition of plants or structures.*—No person shall carry out any demolition of plants or structures containing friable asbestos insulation material and removal of asbestos from building or structures in which asbestos is liable to become airborne, unless he is recognized and duly empowered by the Chief Inspector of Factories as qualified to carry out such work in accordance with the provisions of this schedule.

3. *Tools and equipment.*—Any tools or equipment used in processes to which this schedule applies shall be such that they do not create asbestos dust above the permissible limit or are equipped with efficient exhaust draught.

4. *Exhaust draught.*—(1) An effective exhaust draught shall be provided and maintained to control dust from the following processes and machines as per the relevant National Standards :—

- (a) Manufacture and conveying machinery, namely :—
 - (i) Preparing, grinding, or dry mixing machines ;
 - (ii) Carding, card waste and ring spinning machines, and looms ;
 - (iii) Machines or other plant fed with asbestos ;
 - (iv) Machines used for the sawing, grinding, turning, drilling, abrading or polishing ; in the dry state, of articles composed wholly or partly of asbestos ;

- (b) Cleaning, and grinding of the cylinders or other parts of a carding machine ;
- (c) Chambers, hoppers or other structures into which loose asbestos is delivered or passes ;
- (d) Work benches for asbestos waste sorting or for other manipulation or asbestos by hand ;
- (e) Work places at, which the filling or emptying of sacks, skips or other portable containers, weighing or other process incidental thereto which is effected by hand, is carried on ;
- (f) Sack cleaning machines ;
- (g) Mixing and blending of asbestos by hand ; and
- (h) Any other process in which dust is given off into the work environment.

(2) Exhaust ventilation equipment provided in accordance with subparagraph (1) shall, while any work of maintenance or repair to the machinery, apparatus or other plant or equipment in connection with which it is provided is being carried on, be kept in use so as to produce an exhaust draught which prevents the entry of asbestos dust into the air of any work place.

(3) Arrangements shall be made to prevent asbestos dust discharged from exhaust apparatus being drawn into the air of any work room.

(4) The asbestos bearing dust removed from any work room by the exhaust system shall be collected in suitable receptacles or filter bags which shall be isolated from all work areas.

5. Testing and examination of ventilating systems.—(1) All ventilating systems used for the purpose of extracting or suppressing dust as required by this schedule shall be as per the relevant Indian Standards. Examined and inspected once every week by a responsible person. It shall be thoroughly examined and tested by a competent person once in every period of 12 months. Any defects found by such examinations or test shall be rectified forthwith.

(2) A register containing particulars of such examination and tests and the state of the plant and the repairs or alternations (if any) found to be necessary shall be kept and shall be available for inspection by an Inspector.

6. *Segregation in case of certain process.*—Mixing or blending of asbestos by the hand, or making or repairing of insulating mattresses composed wholly or partly of asbestos shall not be carried on in any room in which any other work is done.

7. *Storage and distribution of loose asbestos.*—All loose asbestos shall, while not in use, be kept in suitable closed receptacles which prevent the escape of asbestos dust therefrom. Such asbestos shall not be distributed within a factory except in closed receptacles or in a totally enclosed system of conveyance.

8. *Asbestos sacks.*—(1) All sacks used as receptacles for the purpose of transport of asbestos within the factory shall be constructed of impermeable materials and shall be kept in good repair.

(2) A sack which has contained asbestos shall not be cleaned by hand beating but by a machine, complying with paragraph 4.

(3) Asbestos sacks or receptacles which contain asbestos shall be disposed off in a safe manner.

9. *Maintenance of floors and work places.*— (1) In every room in which any of the requirements of this schedule apply—

(a) The floors, work benches, machinery and plant shall be kept in a clean state and free from asbestos debris and suitable arrangements shall be made for the storage of asbestos not immediately required for use ; and

(b) The floors shall be kept free from any materials, plant or other articles not immediately required for the work carried on in the room, which would obstruct the proper cleaning of the floor.

(2) The cleaning as mentioned in sub-rule (1) shall so far as is practicable, as carried out by means of vacuum cleaning equipment so designed and constructed and so used that asbestos dust neither escapes nor is discharged into the air of any work place.

(3) When the cleaning is done by any method other than that mentioned in sub-paragraph (2), the persons doing cleaning work and any other person employed in that room shall be provided with respiratory protective equipment and protective clothing.

(4) The vacuum cleaning equipment used in accordance with provisions of sub-paragraph (2), shall be properly maintained and after each cleaning operation, its surfaces kept in a clean state and free from asbestos waste and dust.

(5) Asbestos waste shall not be permitted to remain on the floors or other surfaces at the work place at the end of the working shift and shall be transferred without delay to suitable receptacles. Any spillage of asbestos waste occurring during the course of the work at any time shall be removed and transferred to the receptacles maintained for the purpose without delay.

(A) The occupier shall replace asbestos or of certain types of asbestos or products containing asbestos by other materials or products or shall use alternative technology, scientifically evaluated as harmless or less harmful, wherever this is possible.

(B) The occupier should take all the measures to prevent or control the release of asbestos into the air and to ensure that the exposure limits or other exposure criteria are complied with and also reduce exposure to as low as a level as is reasonably practicable.

10. *Breathing apparatus, personnel protective equipment and clothing.*—(1) The occupier of every factory to which this schedule applies shall provide to workers personnel protective equipments such as hand gloves, shoes, helmets, goggles, earplug, aprons, safety belt, overall suit,

etc. as per the relevant National or International Standards as may be required. The approved breathing apparatus and appropriate work clothing as per the relevant National or International Standards in consultation with the workers representatives and maintained in good conditions for use of every person employed—

- (a) In chambers containing loose asbestos ;
- (b) In cleaning, dust settling or filtering chambers of apparatus ;
- (c) In cleaning the cylinders, including the defer cylinders, or other parts of a carding machine by means of hand stickles ;
- (d) In filling, beating, or leveling in the manufacture or repair of insulating mattresses ; and
- (e) In any other operation or circumstances in which it is impracticable to adopt technical means to control asbestos dust in the work environment within the permissible limit.

(2) Suitable accommodation in conveniently accessible position shall be provided for the use of persons when putting on or taking off breathing apparatus and protective clothing provided in accordance with this rule and for the storage of such apparatus and clothing when not in use.

(3) All breathing apparatus and protective clothing not in use shall be stored in the accommodation provided in accordance with sub-rule (2) above.

(4) All protective clothing in use shall be de-dusted under an efficient exhaust draught or by vacuum cleaning and shall be washed at suitable intervals. The cleaning schedule and procedure should be such as to ensure the efficiency in protective the wearer.

(5) All breathing apparatus shall be cleaned and disinfected at suitable intervals and thoroughly inspected once every month by a responsible person.

(6) A record of the cleaning and maintenance and of the condition of the breathing apparatus shall be maintained in a register provided for that purpose which shall be readily available for inspection by an Inspector.

(7) No person shall be employed to perform any work specified in sub-paragraph (1) for which breathing apparatus is necessary to be provided under that sub-paragraph unless he has been fully instructed in the proper use of that equipment.

(8) No breathing apparatus provided in pursuance of sub-paragraph (1) which has been worn by a person shall be worn by another person unless it has been thoroughly cleaned and disinfected since last being worn and the person has been fully instructed in the proper use of that equipment.

(9) No worker shall take home any work clothing or special protective clothing or personal protective equipment provided to him for protection against exposure to asbestos.

11. *Separate accommodation for personal clothing.*— A separate accommodation shall be provided in a conveniently accessible position for all persons employed in operations to which this schedule applies for storing of personal clothing. This should be separated from the accommodation provided under sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 10 to prevent contamination of personal clothing.

12. *Washing and bathing facilities.*—(1) There shall be provided and maintained in a clean state and in good repair for the use of all workers employed in the processes covered by the schedule, adequate washing and bathing places having a constant supply of water under cover at the rate of one such place for every 15 persons employed.

(2) The washing places shall have stand pipes placed at intervals of not less than one metre.

(3) Not less than one half of the total number of washing places shall be provided with bathrooms.

(4) Sufficient supply of clean towels made of suitable material shall be provided :

Provided that such towels shall be supplied individually for each worker if so ordered by the Inspector.

(5) Sufficient supply of soap and nail brushes shall be provided.

13. *Mess Room.*—(1) There shall be provided and maintained for the use of all workers employed in the factory covered by this schedule, remaining on the premises during the rest intervals, a suitable mess room which shall be furnished with—

- (a) Sufficient tables and benches with back rest ; and
- (b) Adequate means for warming food.

14. *Prohibition of employment of young persons.*—No young person shall be employed in any of the process covered by this schedule.

15. *Prohibition relating to smoking.*—No person shall smoke in any area where processes covered by this schedule are carried on. A notice in the language understood by majority of the workers shall be pasted in the plant prohibiting smoking at such areas.

16. *Pictorial Cautionary notices.*—Cautionary notices in the form specified in appendix and printed in the language easily read and understood by the majority of the workers shall be displayed in prominent places in the work rooms where asbestos or substances containing asbestos are manufactured, handled or used.

17. *Air monitoring.*—To ensure the effectiveness of control measures in continuous or repetitive processes, the monitoring of asbestos fibres in air as well as personal monitoring of workers shall be carried out at least once in every shift and the result so obtained shall be entered in register—

- (a) There should be no substantial change in work place conditions ;
- (b) The results of the (2) preceding measurements have not exceeded half the relevant control limit ;
- (c) All factories should adopt membrane filter test as per the relevant National Standards without fail.

18. *Medical control measures.*—(1) The occupier of every factory in which a worker employed in the processes specified in sub-rule (1), shall ensure that every worker employed be examined by a Medical Inspector of Factories/Certifying Surgeon within 15 days of his first employment. Such medical examination shall include sputum examination for asbestos bodies, pulmonary function test and chest X-ray, Posterior Anterior (PA) view to be compared with standard ILO Radiographs on Pneumoconiosis. No worker shall be allowed to work after 15 days of his first employment in the factory unless certified fit for such employment by the Certifying Surgeon.

(2) Every worker employed in the said processes shall be re-examined by a Certifying Surgeon at least once in every twelve months. Such re-examination shall, wherever the Certifying Surgeon considers appropriate, include all the tests as specified in sub-paragraph (1) except chest X-ray which shall be read by a radiologist specialized/trained in the field of reading ILO Radiographs on Pheumoconiosis and the chest X-ray which shall be carried out at least once in 3 years.

(3) Every worker employed in any of the aforesaid processes on the date on which the schedule comes into force shall be radiological examined by the qualified Radiologist at the cost of the occupier using a standard size X-ray plates and the power of the X-ray machine shall be more than 300 mill Ampere (mA). The report of such X-ray shall be submitted to the Medical Inspector of Factories/Certifying Surgeon/Chief Inspector for within three months of the said date.

(4) If at any time the Medical Inspector of Factories/Certifying Surgeon is of the opinion that a worker is no longer fit for employment in the said process on the ground that continuance therein would involve special danger to the health of the worker he shall make a record of his findings in the said certificate and the health register. The entry of his findings in these documents should also include the period for which he considers that the said person is unfit for work in the said processes. The person so suspended

from the process shall be provided with alternate placement facilities unless he fully is incapacitated in the opinion of the Certifying Surgeon. In which case the person affected shall be suitably rehabilitated.

(5) No person who has been found unfit to work as said in subparagraph (5) above shall be re-employed or permitted to work in the said processes unless the Certifying Surgeon, after further examination, again certifies him fit for employment in those processes.

(6) If a worker already in employment and declared unfit by the Medical Inspector of Factories/Certifying Surgeon shall not be allowed to work on any of the processes specified in sub-rule (1), unless he has been examined again along with standard size chest R-ray plate from a qualified Radiologist at the cost of the occupier and has been certified to be fit to work on the said processes again.

(7) For the purpose of medical supervision by the medical practitioner/ Certifying Surgeon so appointed by the occupier shall be provided for his exclusive use a room in the factory premises which shall be properly cleaned, adequately lighted, ventilated and furnished with a screen, a table with office stationary, chairs and other facilities and other instruments including X-ray arrangements for such examinations and such other equipments as may be prescribed by the Chief Inspector for time to time. The medical practitioner so appointed shall perform the following duties :—

- (a) maintain health register ;
- (b) undertake medical supervision of persons employed in the factory ;
- (c) look after health, education and rehabilitation of sick, injured or affected workers ;
- (d) carry out inspection of work rooms where dangerous operations are carried out and advise the management of the measures to be adopted for the protection of health of the workers employed therein

(8) The health records of the workers exposed to asbestos, shall be kept up to a minimum period of 40 years from the beginning of the employment or 15 years after retirement or cessation of the employment, whichever is later and shall be accessible to workers concerned or their representatives.

(9) The record of medical examinations and appropriate tests carried out by the said medical practitioner, a certificate of fitness and health shall be maintained in separate register approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories, which shall be kept readily available for inspection by the Inspector and produce on demand.

19. *Exemptions.*—(1) If in respect of any factory, the Chief Inspector is satisfied that owing to the exceptional circumstances or infrequency of the processes or for any other reason, all or any of the provisions of this schedule is not necessary for protection of the workers in the factory, the Chief Inspector may by a certificate in writing, which he may at his discretion revoke at any time, exempt such factory from all or any of such provisions subject to such conditions, if any, as he may specify therein.

(2) The Chief Inspector may permit temporary derogation, through a notification in an Official Gazette, from the measures prescribed in this schedule under conditions and within limits of time determined after consultation with the representative organizations of employers and workers concerned.

APPENDIX

PICTORIAL CAUTIONARY NOTICE

1. Asbestos/asbestos dust which is used, handled or manipulated in this factory is a very hazardous to health.
2. Prolonged exposure to asbestos dust may lead to serious diseases like lung fibrosis (Asbestosis) and lung cancer.
3. Entry is prohibited without protective equipment.
4. Wear the protective equipments to safeguard your health.
5. No food stuffs or drinks shall be brought into this area.
6. Smoking, eating food or drinking and chewing tobacco in this area is prohibited.
7. Scrupulous cleanliness shall be maintained in this area.
8. Dry sweeping in this area is prohibited. Any spillage of asbestos shall be cleaned by vacuum cleaning only.
9. A sack or container contaminated with asbestos shall not be cleaned by hand and is to be disposed off by an appropriate method.
10. All protective equipments and clothing shall be re-dusted by vacuum cleaning and stored in an appropriate place provided for the purpose.
11. Entry of unauthorized persons or authorized persons without proper protective equipments is prohibited.
12. Report for the prescribed medical examinations and tests regularly to protect your own health.
13. Report to your doctor immediately if you suffer from persistent breathlessness, chest tightness, or cough.

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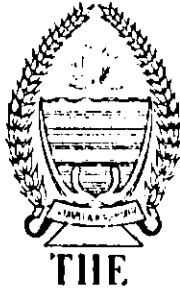

Accordingly, Deputy Commissioner, Kathua was requested to get the revenue papers prepared along with the field book and Shajra Khasra. The revenue papers were prepared by the revenue officials. Further,

Deputy Commissioner, Kathua provided all the revenue papers required to this Collectorate vide their office Letter No. DCK/LA/2012-2013/1062-63 dated 21-12-2011. The papers were then got authenticated from the Project Manager (T), Jammu and were found in order.

Thereafter the notification under section 4 (1) of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt. 1990 was issued by the Collector, LA, ERA, Jammu vide office Letter No. CLA/ERA/J/12/626-36 dated 28-03-2012, whereunder the above mentioned khasra number of the Village Chak Sheikan was notified for the information of all the concerned that the land measuring 6Kanals 11¾ Marlas is needed for the public purpose namely the widening and strengthening of the Kathua Kalibari Hatlimore Road and objections, if any, were called on from the interested persons with regards to the acquisition of the said land within fifteen days from the date of the notification issued in the newspaper. The notification was got published in the two leading local English newspapers namely State Times dated April 16, 2012 and News Point dated April 18, 2012 through Joint Director, Information and was also published in the Government Gazette through General Manager, Ranbir Government Press, Jammu. Besides, a copy of the notification was also served upon the concerned land owners/interested persons through Tehsildar, Kathua to state the nature of their respective claims/interest in the land and the amount and particulars of their claims due to them for compensation for such interest in land. No objections were filed by any land owner/interested person with the office of the Collector Land Acquisition, ERA, Jammu within fifteen days from the date of the publication of the said notification.

After the expiry of the stipulated time for furnishing of the objections from the date of the notification under section 4(1), the case was submitted to the Office of the Deputy Commissioner (District Collector), Kathua for the issuance of declaration/notification under sections 6 and 7 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt. 1990 vide this office Letter No. CLA/ERA/J/12/675-79 dated 22-05-2012. Subsequently vide notification No. 08 DCK of 2012 under the endorsement number DCK/LA/2012-2013/229-34 dated 28-05-2012, declaration stands issued under sections 6 and 7 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt. 1990 by the District Collector (Deputy Commissioner), Kathua.

Consequently notice under sections 9 and 9A of the Land Acquisition Act and Rules was issued vide this office number CLA/ERA/J/12/697-700 dated 12-06-2012 and was published in two leading local English newspapers namely Kashmir Times dated June 18, 2012 and Early Times dated June 16, 2012 inviting objections of land owner/interested persons and indenting department to state the nature of their respective claims with regard to measurement of land and rate of compensation either personally or through their authorized agent within statutory period of fifteen days from the date of publication of this notification.

No any objections have been received either from the land owner/ persons interested or indenting department under sections 9 and 9(A). Tehsildar, Kathua vide his office Letter No. OQ/73 dated 26-04- 2012 conveyed to this Collectorate through the Deputy Commissioner, Kathua (vide Letter No DCK/LA/2012-2013/134 dated 02-05-2012) submitted the average sale/purchase rates for the last three years of the Village Chak Sheikan @ Rs. 1,14,210.00 (One lac fourteen thousand two hundred and ten only) per kanal and the prevailing market rates of Rs. 10,00,000.00 (Ten lacs only) per kanal.

Therefore, keeping in view the above narrated facts and the potential of the land, the undersigned is of the opinion that uniform rate of Rs. 600,000.00 (Six lacs) per kanal seems genuine in the instant case, further also the Rate Determination Committee of the Collectors, Kathua which met on 21-08-2012 at DC Office, Kathua after taking into consideration the merits/vicinity of the land that falls in Village Chaksheikan under the municipal council limitation, a uniform rate of Rs. 600,000.00 (Six lacs only) per kanal was approved by the Deputy Commissioner, Kathua in the said case and was further communicated to this Collectorate vide their office Letter No. DCK/LA/2012-13/467 dated 23-08-2012 as the acquisition of land is compulsory Jabrana @ 15% is also admissible on the land compensation amount which has been taken into account during the preparation of the apportionment statement in terms of the section 23 of State Land Acquisition Act and Rules, the total award amount comes to Rs 45,45,375/- (Rupees forty five lacs forty five thousand three hundred and seventy five only).

Necessary apportionment statement depicting the cost of the land along with the Jabrana @ 15% is shown as Annexure 'A'.

As per the standing instructions of the State Government to the Revenue Department issued from time to time it stands certified :

- (1) That the land is acquired for the widening and the strengthening of the Kathua Kalibari Hatli More road at Village Chaksheikan, Tehsil and District Kathua.
- (2) That the funds are reportedly available with the indenting department.
- (3) That the proposed land for the acquisition has neither been acquired by the indenting department through private negotiation nor any payment of land compensation has been made to the land owners/persons interested in the land.
- (4) That no land acquisition proceeding are going on with any other Collectorate on this account.
- (5) That the payment shall be made strictly in accordance with the provision of the J&K Agrarian Reforms Act, 1976 and the instructions issued from time to time.

Therefore, I, Rajneesh Gupta, KAS, Collector, Land Acquisition, ERA, Jammu in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 11 of the J&K State Land Acquisition Act, Smvt. 1990 hereby make the final award in the subject case for an amount of Rs. 45,45,375/- (Rupees forty five lacs forty five thousand three hundred and seventy five only) on the account of land compensation including the 15% Jabrana on the aggregate of the land compensation for the land acquired. Hence, the final award is hereby issued under my hand and seal today on the 22nd day of March, 2014.

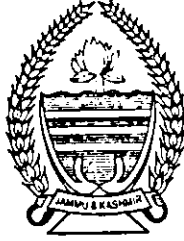
