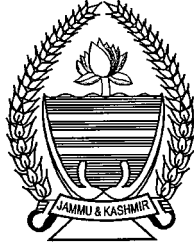

and/or designations, while signing the instruments of the Government,
like orders, endorsements, etc., despite the fact that a number of
circulars have been issued by the Government, from time to time,
to this fact. Attention in this regard, is invited towards the circular

instructions conveyed vide Nos. 10-GAD of 2004 dated 14-07-2004, 16-GAD of 2011 dated 08-04-2011, 23-GAD of 2012 dated 09-08-2012, 20-GAD of 2013 dated 10-09-2013, 06-GAD of 2014 dated 23-01-2014 and 07-GAD of 2015 dated 10-02-2015.

Besides ensuring transparency, which is requirement under the J&K Right to Information Act, indicating the name and designation, minimizes the scope for issuance of fake orders/documents. The State Information Commission has also impressed upon the officers that they should invariably give the names and designations while putting their signatures.

It is, accordingly, once again enjoined upon all the officers that they should indicate the name and designation while signing any instrument of the Government or processing any papers/file.

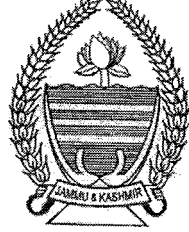

AWARD

1. Section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act (herein referred to as Act). Envisages that where the appropriate Government is of the opinion that any industrial dispute exists or apprehended, it may at any time in writing referred to the dispute or any matter appearing to be connected with or relevant to the dispute to the Industrial Tribunal or the Labour Court for adjudication.

2. The authority identified by the State Government under the Act while having sufficient compliance with the provision of Act has made a reference to this tribunal vide SRO No. 50 on dated 28th of February, 2005 for adjudication and passing an appropriate order. The reference made by the Government broadly and pointedly after having proper consideration by the Reconciliation Officer. Government is of the opinion that industrial dispute exists between Balmukand, Plumber and Dev Kumar, Electrician V/s. Management of Kashmir Steel Rolling Mills, Bari Brahmana, Jammu.

So in exercise of powers conferred by clause (C) of sub-section (1) of the section 10 of Industrial Disputes Act, 1947. Government referred this dispute for adjudication on the following issues :—

1. Whether the action of Management of M/s. Kashmir Steel Rolling Mills, Bari Brahmana, Jammu in terminating the services of the above name workmen is legally right ?
2. If not, what relief, they are entitle ?
3. Fundamentally and primarily reference which made by the authority to this tribunal is based on report submitted by the Conciliation Officer.
4. On receiving the reference from the Government this tribunal has issued the notices to both sides for filing the statement of facts and objections from other side. Workmen/petitioners appeared and file their claim alleging in that respondent management has terminated the services of petitioners on 29-08-1999 verbally. No notice or any chargesheet has been given to them for any misconduct against the petitioner. No enquiry has been held

against them. Petitioner No. 1 working as plumber continuously till the termination without complying any provision of law. He was getting salary of Rs. 2300/- per month at that time. There was no misconduct against the petitioners and total service record was neat and clean. Whereas, petitioner No. 2 was working as electrician continuously regularly till termination. He was getting the salary of Rs. 2950/- per month at that time. Foremen of the factory beaten badly the petitioner No. 2 and he approach the employer. But instead of investigating into the matter, asked them to leave the factory. So, there is a dispute under the provision of I. D. Act, 1947 before the Conciliation Officer, Jammu. Conciliation Officer amicably settled the dispute on 17-11-1999 but respondent refused to take them on duty. Petitioners had been working with the respondent for the last three years under the employment of respondent but the respondent terminated them without any notice or chargesheet and without conducting any enquiry against them. No retrenchment compensation has been paid to them as such termination illegal against the law. And finally prayed for, their reinstatement alongwith with full back wages and other benefits with interest and also bonus for the year 1998-99.

5. Respondents also appeared but have not filed any objection as per proceeding of file.

6. The claim of the petitioners as reflected in the conciliation proceeding and projected by the petitioners. As that petitioners Balmukand and Dev Kumar were employed by the respondent as plumber and electrician and they were working with the employer for the last three years to the satisfaction of their superior. Respondent has terminated both the employees without any notice or chargesheet and without any enquiry. Respondent replied to the claim of the petitioners before the Conciliation Officer stated that both the petitioners had absented from the employment without any intimation or permission of the employer. They have not been terminated from the service so the question of payment of back wages does not arise. But as per petitioner they never absented from the service and actually they have been terminated by the employer without giving any notice, chargesheet and they have not conducted any enquiry. However, before the Conciliation Officer during the conciliation proceeding at one stage

settlement were arrived between the parties on 17-11-99 whereas, respondent agreed to reinstate both the workers in the factory in case they are ready to resume the service. Petitioners agreed and they have been directed to go on work as earlier they were performing their duties. But after sometime petitioner came back before the Conciliation Officer alleging in that respondent refused to engage them. So settlement failed because respondents asked the petitioners to handover their resignation for full and final settlement of their account. So the conciliation has been failed and Conciliation Officer recommend the matter be referred to Industrial Dispute Tribunal.

7. To prove the case of the parties they have been directed to lead their evidence. Petitioners have examined P. W. Kishori Lal and petitioner Balmukand, Dev Kumar as their witnesses. Whereas, respondent have examined P. W. Natha Singh and Richard Sharma. It is profitable to give brief resume of both side witnesses statement.

8. P. W. Balmukand stated that in the year October, 1998 he joined the service with the respondent as Plumber-cum-Feeder and he was terminated by the employer on 13 August, 1999 he was appointed verbally and also terminated verbally no notice has been given, he was being paid Rs. 2300/- per month. He was beaten by foreman and later on terminated. He made a complaint with the Labour Department and there we reached on a settlement with employer. As per settlement employer was directed to re-engage them, then he approach the respondent but he refused to allow him to work in the factory. On cross examination stated that he was terminated by foreman. He reported the matter to the official they said him to talk with foreman. Foreman was from Punjab and he was engaged by him. This is not correct that he was absented from the duty. Labour Officer went with him to the management and they replied that officers is not ready to accept him.

9. P. W. Dev Kumar stated that he was working with the management as electrician from 1996. No appointment letter was given to him. On 29-08-99 foreman, Natha Singh has paid the salary of Rs. 2950/- and terminated. He was beaten on 02-08-99 and 19-08-99 and 29-08-99

but he does not know why he has been beaten. Then he went to the management manager who has not enquired about beating but on 29-08-99 he was thrown out of gate. And then approached to the Reconciliation Officer and matter was settle amicably by the Reconciliation Officer. On 17-11-99 he went on duty but Dewan Bansal owner has refuse to engage them as per agreement on duty but compelled to handover the resignation and get full and final account of service. So again we approach to the Conciliation Officer who said that matter is referred to Government. They have not been given any notice or chargesheet. He is unemployed right now. On cross examination stated that it is not correct that he was absented from the duty as he himself left the job and he refused to attend the duty. He has performed the duty alone and when Conciliation Officer asked me to join. He went alone and met with owner. He was allowed to went inside the factory there was a security guard namely Sadhu Singh. He has also talk with the owner and then allowed him.

He was not met with the foreman. When for the first time he went for employment. In those days foreman was engaging the workmen and foreman has asked him to worked and get the pay.

10. Kishori Lal stated that he was working as welder. He has joined the job in the 1998. He knows the Balmukand who was plumber in the factory and also knows Dev Kumar who was working as electrician. They have joined the service 2/3 years earlier to him. They worked continuously when they have been terminated from the service no notice or enquiry was conducted against them. And retrenchment benefits have not been paid. They have preferred a case with the Labour Department and from where they got a decision. As per that decision management has not kept them in service. Though they approached. On cross examination stated that they have not left the job on their own but they have been beaten and abused by foreman. He was on spot when they were beaten no money was paid to them.

11. In rebuttal respondent has examined only two witnesses by way of affidavits. But one of the R. W. Natha Singh has been cross examined. Whereas other R. W. has not been cross examined by the petitioner because witness did not turn up in the court for a long time and ex parte has been

initiated against the respondent. Now, brief assume of the statement of the respondent witness are as under :—

12. R. W. Natha Singh has stated on oath that he knows the petitioners who are employed as plumber and electrician in the respondent firm. They left the job on their own and were paid all their dues by the respondent, in his presence in the office of the company when petitioners signed the boucher affirming and acknowledging the payment of their employment dues to them. They have been paid leave salary, bonus etc. on 23-12-99 he further stated that he has never beaten the petitioner on 02-08-99 or 10-08-99 as allege by them in court proceedings. Their services has not been terminated by the respondent. They have concocted story in which it is alleged they have been beaten. It is totally wrong. If it happened so they must have filed an FIR. On cross examination stated that petitioner has deposed that he joined the factory in the year 1982. No appointment letter was issued. Mr. Agarwal was manager of the factory and affidavit was drafted in the office of the factory. He has told that both the petitioners paid in his presence he is not remembering the date of the ouster of the worker. He does know the salary of the worker at the time of ouster. They have not been terminated but left the job at their own. No letter was issued to the worker for resuming the duties. Affidavit was read over to him. He has not seen the boucher in the court. No notice was issued to the worker for their absence from their duties.

13. R. W. Richard Sharma stated on affidavit that he knew the petitioners who were employed has plumber and electrician in the respondent firm. They left the job on their own. Petitioner were paid their salary, leave wages and bonus etc. by the respondent on 23-12-1999. On 02-08-1999 and 10-08-1999 nobody has beaten them. As they have alleged in the court proceedings. Petitioners have concocted so called story of beating which is not based on facts. Fact in the same has been done by the petitioners only to lend a false credence to their manufactured story.

14. This is the whole sum and substance of both side evidence which produced by them during the proceedings.

15. I have thoughtfully considered argument advanced by the representative of the parties and had a minute study and appreciation of the evidence both oral as well as documentary available on case file.

16. This court has to return the findings within the circumscribed limits of the term of reference identified by the competent authority appointed by the Government and we are not supposed and expected to travel beyond the term set up for adjudication. What is required to be settled precisely is to be finding out legality or otherwise action of respondent management in this case. Termination of services of respondent is legally valid or not. In case where the action as taken up by respondent in terminating the services of the petitioner is held illegal, is assuming for the sake of argument then it is to be seen what appropriate relief can be given to the petitioner on account of such illegal action.

17. Briefly petitioners were employee of the factory which definitely covered under section 2 (S) of Industrial Disputes Act and parties have not disputed on this point. The grievances of the petitioners are as that they have been appointed as plumber and electrician in the factory. They have been terminated from their services on 13-08-1999 and 29-08-1999 no notice has been given to them. As the petitioner No. 2 has been beaten badly by the foreman of the factory. He approached to the employer with regard to beating but instead of investigating the matter he has thrown out both verbally. So they raised a dispute under the provision of I. D. Act, 1947 before the Conciliation Officer where amicably matter was settled with the respondent but the respondent refused to take them on duty as per the settlement agreement. And settlement agreement is also attested by the Conciliation Officer and signed by both parties. As per settlement respondent agreed to take petitioners back into service in case petitioners want to resume their services in the factory, he has no objections. And accordingly they went on duty. Employer refused to engage them and directed the petitioner to settle the amount full and final. As services of petitioners are not required by the factory. As such settlement failed and appropriate authority referred the dispute to this tribunal.

18. Respondents have participated in the proceeding but they not filed any objection to the claim of the petitioner before this tribunal. Though they have cross examined the petitioner witnesses and also produced two RW namely Richard Sharma and Natha Singh. The petitioner evidence established clearly that petitioner Balmukand have been engaged in service in 1998 and terminated in the month of August, 1999. He was verbally appointed by the foreman. He was earning 2300/- per month from the factory. Petitioner Dev Kumar was working with the factory since 1996 as electrician and he was terminated verbally by foreman. Both have not been chargesheeted or any notice have been given to them neither inquiry has been conducted by the management. All the PW's have supported their contention clearly. But the defense evidence stand is different that workers have not been terminated but they have left at their own. They have never been beaten by the foreman of the factory.

19. Now, the question arises if the workers have not been terminated but before the Cociliation Officer employer agreed to re-engage them as per settlement between parties duly attested by the Conciliation Officer. If they have left their job at their own they must have been given any information with regard to their disengagement from the roll of the factory but there is nothing on the record which shows that they have been informed about their absence.

Whereas, petitioners approach the Conciliation Officer on 22-11-1999 alleging that they have been wrongfully terminated from the services, when they have already completed more than 240 days continuously in service. Moreover respondents have not filed any objection with regard to claim of the petitioners in this tribunal.

20. In terms of evidence on record adduced by the petitioners comprises of the statement of two petitioners and a witness it abundantly clear that petitioner and witness have deposed in one voice that the petitioner was terminated verbally by the management of the factory. And no notice was given to them neither they have been chargesheeted nor any inquiry has been conducted which is clearly against the provision of I. D. Act. Though it has also come in the evidence that one of the petitioner was

beaten by foreman in the factory and he approached to the management with the complaint but instead of investigating they have thrown him out from the factory. Workers have completed 240 days in a calendar years continuously. So they were conferred with a right of workmen and the respondent management therefore in turn was under obligation to observe the mandate and procedure laid down under section 25F of Industrial Disputes Act, before terminating their services or before retrenchment of the petitioner what so ever. Section 25F provide that where any workmen continuously to work more than 240 days in a year he acquires some right and privilege in defending the case of retrenchment and under this section it is provided that no workmen employed in any industry shall be retrenched by the employer until the workmen has been given one month notice, indicating reason for retrenchment. Further, more termination of a workman without conducting an inquiry without payment of retrenchment compensation and one months pay in lieu of notice is liable to set aside and workmen will be entitled to reinstatement. It has also come in the evidence of the petitioner that they are unemployed they have not been engaged by any other business institution. But there is no evidence from the defense to rebut the contention of petitioner which shows that workmen have been employed after their retrenchment anywhere.

21. So, it is clearly established that petitioner have been terminated by the employer without giving a proper chance of hearing and without conducting enquiry. There is no sufficient proof on the file which shows that they have left the job at their own. Respondents have also admitted before the Conciliation Officer for reinstatement of the worker which is attested by him. If they absented from their job they must have been informed for disengaging from the service but it is no where in black and white. So termination without any notice or enquiry is not a legally justified termination. In support of my contention, laid by hands on an authority of Himachal Pardesh High Court 2008 page 284 held as under :—

Reinstatement with back wages when termination of service of workmen not legal termination of workmen without conducting any enquiry and without issuing one month notice held to be violative of the service rule and section 25F of the Industrial Disputes

Act, 1947 workmen placing an affidavit to the effect that he was not gainfully employed after its retrenchment same not rebutted by the employer by placing any material on record workmen held entitled for reinstatement with full back wages and also interest @ 9% per annum from date he was allowed to resume duties.

22. In the instant case petitioners have stated on oath in their statement that they remain unemployed after termination and same has not been rebutted by the other side. So the petitioners are without any employment. And employer has statutory obligation to comply with the conditions precedents in making payment of retrenchment compensation and one month's wages in lieu of one month's notice at the time termination of the workmen and in the absence of the such payment, termination will be avoid *ab initio*. As it has been held by the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in 2006 LLR 835—

“Since the respondents were workmen under the Industrial Disputes Act. Section 25F of the Act had to be complied with, if any, had put in over 240 days of service. Hence, the termination of their service without notice was illegal, since the compliance of section 25F is a condition precedent to the termination of service.”

23. In view of the above, the termination of the petitioners by the respondent management is illegal invalid unwarranted and uncalled for and against the principal of natural justice. Therefore, the termination of the petitioner by respondent management hereby set aside and respondent directed to reinstate the petitioner forthwith. Admittedly, the petitioners have rendered services for more than 240 days in calendar years as required. There is nothing sustainable accepting the averment that the petitioners had left the service at their own. Petitioners were working purely on temporary base. Even otherwise, taking over all view of the matter as well as evidence brought on record, it is clear that petitioners have not worked anywhere else.

24. So far as back wages in question is concerned, I realized that admittedly as come in their evidence that they remain unemployed during

the pendency of the case. It is well settled and it is necessary to consider facts and circumstances of the each case before granting back wages. This is a case where petitioners have been terminated illegally in the year 1999 and matter is long pending and they have not work with the factory. So, I think to grant full back wages without work is not proper justify for long period, but this is also directed to reinstate the petitioner forthwith. Admittedly, the petitioners have rendered services for more than 240 days in calendar years as required. There is nothing sustainable accepting the averment that the petitioners had left the service at their own. Petitioners were working purely on temporary base. Even otherwise, taking over all view of the matter as well as evidence brought on record, it is clear that petitioners have not worked anywhere else.

24. So far as back wages in question is concerned, I realized that admittedly as come in their evidence that they remains unemployed during the pendency of the case. It is well settled and it is necessary to consider the facts and circumstances of the each case before granting back wages. On this point I relied on judgement of Hon'ble Bombay High Court, 2012 LLR page 1034 relevant para 11 which is reproduced as under :—

“Admittedly, as recorded above, petitioner is disabled and project affected person. In the complaint, though very averments are made i. e. he is unable to earn and run the family and also no one else working in any Government Department and therefore, family were suffering because of the poor condition ; and he has no source of income, yet these averments have never been challenged and/or remained unchallenged, are sufficient to defend the submission made by the Learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner that there was no evidence or material placed on record that he was without job and was not earning anything during this period. These averments as are not denied, the observation that the burden lies upon the respondent to prove the same is not correct. I am, therefore, inclined to accept the averments made that he was not earning during this period, as he was out of job during this period. It is well settled and it is necessary to consider the facts and circumstances of each case before granting back wages ; a case is made out to modify the order and direct the

petitioner to pay 50% back wages. I am inclined duce 50% also for the reasons that admittedly, the respondent never rendered services during this period with the petitioner. The reduction to 50% back wages in my opinion is proper and reasonable compensation.

25. This is a case where petitioners have been terminated illegally in the year 1999 and matter is long pending and they have not work with the factory. So, I think to grant full back wages without work is not proper justify for a long period, but this is also correct that workers have not work during this period anywhere. As it have been come in the petitioners evidence which remain unrebutted by other side. Keeping in mind the facts and circumstances of the case respondent is hereby directed to pay 50% back wages from the date of termination till reinstatement. Accordingly, an award as passed in favour of the petitioners and against the respondent management. Copy of the award be sent to the Government of J&K through its Commissioner/Secretary, Labour Department for information and for publication in the Government Gazette.

**THE RIGHT TO FAIR COMPENSATION AND TRANSPARENCY
IN LAND ACQUISITION, REHABILITATION AND
RESETTLEMENT (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 2015**

(No. 4 of 2015)

Promulgated by the President in the Sixty-fifth Year of the Republic of India.

An Ordinance further to amend the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013.

Whereas, the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (Amendment) Ordinance, 2014 to amend the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013 (the RFCTLARR Act, 2013) was promulgated by the President on the 31st day of December, 2014 ;

And whereas, the RFCTLARR (Amendment) Bill, 2015 was introduced on the 24th February, 2015 in the House of the People to replace the said Ordinance and the said Bill was passed along with amendments on the 10th March, 2015 in the House of the People ;

And whereas, the RFCTLARR (Amendment) Bill, 2015 as passed by the House of the People could not be passed by the Council of States and is pending in that House ;

And whereas, the Council of States is not in session and the President is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of Article 123 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to promulgate the following Ordinance :—

1. *Short title and commencement.*—(1) This Ordinance may be called the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (Amendment) Ordinance, 2015.

(2) It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 31st day of December, 2014.

2. *Substitution of certain expression throughout the Act.*— In the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013 (30 of 2013) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), for the words “private company” wherever they occur, the words “private entity” shall be substituted.

3. *Amendment of section 2.*—In the principal Act, in sub-section (2) of section 2, after the second proviso, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely :—

“Provided also that the acquisition of land for the projects listed in sub-section (1) of section 10A and the purposes specified therein shall be exempted from the provisions of the first proviso to this sub-section.”.

4. *Amendment of section 3.*—In the principal Act, in section 3—

- (i) in clause (j) in sub-clause (i), for the words and figures “the Companies Act, 1956”, (1 of 1956) the words and figures “the Companies Act, 2013” (18 of 2013) shall be substituted ;
- (ii) after clause (y), the following clause shall be inserted, namely :—

“(yy) “private entity” means any entity other than a Government entity or undertaking and includes a proprietorship, partnership, company, corporation, non-profit organisation or other entity under any law for the time being in force ;”.

5. *Insertion of new Chapter IIIA.*—In the principal Act, after Chapter III, the following Chapter shall be inserted, namely :—

“Chapter IIIA

Provisions of Chapter II and Chapter III not to apply to certain projects

10A. *Power of appropriate Government to exempt certain projects.*—(1) The appropriate Government may, in the public interest, by notification, exempt any of the following projects from the application of the provisions of Chapter II and Chapter III of this Act, namely :—

- (a) such projects vital to national security or defence of India and every part thereof, including preparation for defence or defence production ;

- (b) rural infrastructure including electrification ;
- (c) affordable housing and housing for the poor people ;
- (d) industrial corridors set up by the appropriate Government and its undertakings (in which case the land shall be acquired up to one kilometer on both sides of designated railway line or roads for such industrial corridor) ; and
- (e) infrastructure projects including projects under public-private partnership where the ownership of land continues to vest with the Government :

Provided that the appropriate Government shall, before the issue of notification, ensure the extent of land for the proposed acquisition keeping in view the bare minimum land required for such project.

(2) The appropriate Government shall undertake a survey of its wasteland including arid land and maintain a record containing details of such land, in such manner as may be prescribed by the appropriate Government.

6. *Amendment of section 24.*—In the principal Act, in section 24, in sub-section (2), after the proviso, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely :—

“Provided further that in computing the period referred to in this sub-section, any period or periods during which the proceedings for acquisition of the land were held up on account of any stay or injunction issued by any court or the period specified in the award of a tribunal for taking possession or such period where possession has been taken but the compensation lying deposited in a court or in any designated account maintained for this purpose shall be excluded.”.

7. *Amendment of section 31.*—In the principal Act, in section 31, in sub-section (2), in clause (h), after the words “affected families”, the words “including compulsory employment to at least one member of such affected family of a farm labourer” shall be inserted.

8. *Amendment of section 46.*—In the principal Act, in section 46, in sub-section (6), in the Explanation, in clause (b), the words “any person other than” shall be omitted.

9. *Insertion of new section 67A.*—In the principal Act, after section 67, the following section shall be inserted, namely :—

‘67A. Hearing to be held by Authority in district or districts to decide grievances.—The Authority shall, after receiving reference under section 64 and after giving notice of such reference to all parties concerned, hold the hearing in the district where the land acquisition takes place for settlement of the objections raised in the reference.’

10. *Substitution of new section for section 87.*—In the principal Act, for section 87, the following section shall be substituted, namely :—

“87. Offences by Government officials.—Where an offence under this Act has been committed by any person who is or was employed in the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be, at the time of commission of such alleged offence, the court shall take cognizance of such offence provided the procedure laid down in section 197 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is followed”.

11. *Amendment of section 101.*—In the principal Act, in section 101, for the words “a period of five years”, the words “a period specified for setting up of any project or for five years, whichever is later” shall be substituted.

12. *Amendment of section 105.*—In the principal Act, in section 105—

(i) for sub-section (3), the following sub-section shall be substituted, namely :—

“(3) The provisions of this Act relating to the determination of compensation in accordance with the First Schedule,

rehabilitation and resettlement in accordance with the Second Schedule and infrastructure amenities in accordance with the Third Schedule shall apply to the enactments relating to land acquisition specified in the Fourth Schedule with effect from 1st January, 2015.” ;

(ii) sub-section (4) shall be omitted.

13. *Amendment of section 113.*—In the principal Act, in section 113, in sub-section (1)—

(i) for the words “the provisions of this Part”, the words “the provision of this Act” shall be substituted ;

(ii) in the proviso, for the words “a period of two years”, the words “a period of five years” shall be substituted.

14. *Repeal and saving.*—(1) The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (Amendment) Ordinance, 2014 (9 of 2014) is hereby repealed.

(2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken under the principal Act, as amended by the said Ordinance, shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the principal Act, as amended by this Ordinance.
