Whereas, on the basis of indent placed by Assistant Commissioner Development (ACD), Ramban vide ACDR/MPC Batroo/2017-18/14873-76 dated 20-12-2017, Collector Land Acquisition (ACR), Ramban issued notification under section 4(1) of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt., 1990 vide No. Acq/Gen/2017-18/796-806 dated 09-01-2018, for land measuring 02 Kanals 03 Marlas for public purpose i. e. Construction of Community Hall, Batroo at Village Dhanmasta, Tehsil Pogal Paristan, District Ramban ; and

Whereas, pursuant to the above referred notification, no objection was received from the interested persons within the stipulated time and Collector submitted the case to District Collector (DC), Ramban for issuance of notification under sections 6, 7 and 17 of the said Act ; and

Whereas, District Collector (DC), Ramban vide No. DC/LA/Rbn/ 273-74 dated 05-09-2019 recommended the case to Divisional Commissioner, Jammu for issuance of notification under sections 6, 7 and 17 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt., 1990. Divisional Commissioner, Jammu vide No. 502/3691/Acq/Dhanmasta/Rbn/19/2541-42 dated 19-10-2019 endorsed the case to Financial Commissioner (Revenue), J&K, who vide No. FC-LS/LA/5063/19 dated 23-10-2019 forwarded to this department for the said purpose ; and

Whereas, the case was examined in the department and vide No. Rev/LAJ/320/2019 dated 27-10-2019, some deficient documents were sought ; and

Whereas, further examination of the case rervealed that the indent has been placed by the Assistant Commissioner Development (ACD), Ramban and it has been mentioned that funds are not available and for placing indent instructions have been issued by the department vide Circular No. Rev/LAJK/375/2016 dated 30-12-2016 which provides as :

- (i) Henceforth, the indent for acquisition of land under the provisions of the State Land Acquisition Act shall not be entertained if it has not been placed by the respective Head of the Government Department/Agency/Corporation addressed to the Destrict Collector only.
- (ii) While placing the indent, the Head of the Department (HoD) eoncerned shall specifically certify that he/she has duly been authorized by the Administrative Department concerned for acquisition of the land on behalf of the said department.

Whereas, the case has been recommended for issuance of declaration under sections 6, 7 and 17 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt., 1990. Section

Payment of compensation before acquisition proceedings are completed.—Before taking possession of any land under section 17, the Collector shall, without prejudice to the provisions of the said section ;

(a) Tender payment of eighty per centum of the compensation for such land as estimated by him to the persons interested and entitled thereto; and

Whereas, the interested persons had already filed a writ petition WP (C) No. 2670/2019 titled Krishan Singh and another V/s State of Jammu and Kashmir and Ors. in the Hon'ble High Court of J&K. Hon'ble High Court disposed of the writ petition vide order dated 30-12-2021, among other directions also directed \therefore to conclude the acquisition proceedings by issuing a declaration under section 6 of the Act and pronouncing the final award within a period of three months from today and to pay the compensation as per the award to the petitioners forthwith subject to any reference or appeal that may be preferred against the award"; and

Whereas, the J&K Rural Development Department vide communication No. RDD-Legal/25/2022-09-RDD dated 11-01-2022 requested this department to consider the case for issuance of notification under section 6 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt., 1990 in compliance to the directions passed by the Hon'ble High Court, Jammu ; and

Whereas, on the above basis, the case has been examined in the department, since the indenting department has also requested to consider the case for issuance of notification under section 6 of the Land Acquisition Act, Smvt. 1990 and further the interested persons had not filed objection to the acquisition of the said land within stipulated time ; and

Whereas, the Government is satisfied that the aforementioned land is required for public purpose i. e. construction of Community Hall, Batroo; and

Whereas, the instant acquisition is already initiated under the J&K Land Acquisition Act, and in view of the advice of the department of Law, the acquisition proceedings are to be completed under the provisions of the said Act.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 6 of the J&K Land Acquisition Act, Samvat 1990, it is declared that the land measuring 02 Kanals and 03 Marlas at Village Dhanmasta, Tehsil Pogal Paristan, District Ramban is required for public purpose i. e. construction of Community Hall, Batroo. Further, the Collector Land Acquisition (ACR), Ramban is directed under section 7 of the said Act to take order for acquisition of the said land after giving prescribed notice to the interested person(s) as required under section 9 of the Land Acquisition Act/Rules.

Further, in pursuance of section 17 of the Land Acquisition Act, Samvat 1990, it is also ordered that on expiry of fifteen days from the publication of the notification under section 9(2) of the said act, the Collector will take possession of the aforementioned land in Village Dhanmasta, Tehsil Pogal Paristan, District Ramban required for public purpose, subject to fulfillment of the conditions prescribed under section 9(2) and section17-A of the Land Acquisition Act and Rule 63 of the Land Acquisition Rules.



Whereas, during investigation, suspect Reyaz Ahmad Gujjar S/o Nazir Ahmad R/o Kunderdhan, Chassana was arrested in connection with the case and during questioning he disclosed that he was in touch with PoK based terrorist Mohammad Amin @ Khobib S/o Dawood Ahmad Bhat R/o Kathawa, Thathri who provided some locations to accused through social media in Makhidar and Upper Shikara forests where some arms/ammunition was dumped by the terrorists. He further disclosed that arms/ammunition which were kept in Makhidar forest was recovered by the Police, however, on his disclosure 2 UBGL grenades, 4 hand grenades, 1 RPG ammunition, 3 Motar Bomb, 250 kgs. explosive, 30 INSAS rounds, 20 AK 47 rounds were recovered from Upper Shikara forests ; and

4. Whereas, during investigation, three persons Nisar Ahmad Bhat S/o Gh. Mohammad Bhat R/o Singhpora, Rahil Ahmad Parray S/o Bashir Ahmad R/o Kanihama, Magam and Mohammad Arif Mir S/o Gh. Mohammad R/o Mazhama, Magam were found involved in the case. SO-383.ô In exercise of the powers conferred by section 32 of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, the Government hereby the following rules ; namely :ô

CHAPTER I

Preliminary

1. Short title and commencement.ô (1) These rules may be called the Jammu and Kashmir Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Rules, 2021.

2. They shall come into force from the date of their notification in the Official Gazette.

2. **Definitions**.ô In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,ó

- (a) "Act" means the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 (56 of 2007);
- (b) "Application" means an application made to a tribunal under section 5 of the Act ;
- (c) "Blood Relations" in the context of a male and a female inmate, mean father-daughter, mother-son, and brothersister (not cousins);
- (d) "Form" means a form appended to these rules ;
- (e) **"Government'**ø means the Government of Jammu and Kashmir ;
- (f) "**Inmate**", in relation to an old age home, means a senior citizen duly admitted to reside in such a home ;
- (g) "Opposite Party" means the party against whom an application for maintenance has been filed under section 4 of the Act ;
- (h) "Presiding Officer" means an officer appointed to preside over a Maintenance Tribunal referred to under subsection (2) of section 7 or an Appellate Tribunal under sub-section (2) of section 15;
- (i) ∴Scheduleø means a Schedule appended to these rules ;
- (j) \exists Section ϕ means a section of the Act ;

Words and expressions defined in the Act but not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

CHAPTER II

Procedure for Maintenance Tribunal, Appellate Tribunal and Conciliation Officers

3. **Constitution of Maintenance Tribunal**.ô (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, constitute for each Sub-Division, one or more Tribunals as may be specified in the notification for the purpose of adjudicating and deciding upon the order for maintenance under section 5 of the Act.

(2) The Additional District Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate concerned shall function as Presiding Officer of the Tribunal. The Presiding Officer may be assisted by such other officers as may be notified by the Government from the following categories :ô

- (a) Tehsildar within the jurisdiction ;
- (b) Deputy Superintendent of Police within the jurisdiction;
- (c) two non-official members as prescribed under these rules ; and
- (d) any officer from Social Welfare Department in the concerned District.

(3) The Government shall, by notification in the official Gazette, constitute for each District, one Appellate Tribunal under section 15 of the Act, as may be specified in the notification for the purpose of hearing appeals against the order of the Tribunal. The Appellate Tribunal shall be headed by District Magistrate, who may be assisted by such other Members as may be notified by the Government from the following categories :ô

- (a) Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate ;
- (b) Additional Superintendent of Police concerned district ;
- (c) two non-official members as prescribed under these rules ; and

(d) any officer from the Social Welfare Department in the District ;

(4) The non-official members, one of whom shall be a women, shall have the following qualifications, namely :ô

- (a) he/she shall not be less than 35 years of age in case of Maintenance Tribunal and not less than 50 years of age in case of Appellate Tribunal;
- (b) he/she should possess a post-graduate degree from a recognized university in case of Maintenance Tribunal and should possess a Post-Graduate Degree in Social Work/ Sociology/Anthropology/Gerontology in case of Appellate Tribunal ;
- (c) he/she shall be a person of ability, integrity and standing and should have adequate knowledge and experience of at least 10 years of working for the welfare of senior citizens in the area of health, woman empowerment and social welfare in case of Maintenance Tribunal and 15 years of working in case of Appellate Tribunal;
- (d) he/she should be domicile of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir :

Provided that a person shall be disqualified for appointment as a member if he/sheô

- (i) has been convicted and sentenced to imprisonment for an offence which in the opinion of the Government involves moral turpitude ; or
- (ii) is an undischarged insolvent ; or
- (iii) is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court ; or
- (iv) has been removed or dismissed from the service of the Government or a body corporate owned or controlled by the Government.

(5) Every appointment of non-official members under these rules shall be made by the Government on the recommendations of a Selection Committee consisting of the following, namely :6

- (i) Administrative Secretary, Chairperson Social Welfare Department
- (ii) Director, Social Welfare, Member(s) Kashmir/Jammu
- (iii) One representative from the Member State Council for Senior Citizens
- (iv) Deputy Commissioner of the Member concerned District
- (v) One representative from academic Member bodies concerned with social work, psychology and sociology with experience of working on the issues of aged persons
- (vi) Any officer, not below the rank Member-Secretary of Deputy Director, Social Welfare to be nominated by Social Welfare Department

(6) The Selection Committee at the time of recommending names for appointment of non-official members for assisting the Tribunal and Appellate Tribunal shall also prepare a panel of names for each Tribunal/Appellate Tribunal to fill the vacancies that may arise due to non-joining, resignation or death of non-official members.

(7) The non-official members shall hold office for a term of three years from the date on which they join the office or up to the age of 65, whichever is earlier :

Provided that a member shall be eligible for reappointment for another term of three years or up to the age of 65, whichever is earlier, subject to the condition that he fulfills the qualification and other conditions for appointment as prescribed and such reappointment is also made on the basis of the recommendation Selection Committee.

(8) A Member can resign any time, by giving one month advance notice in writing under his hand, or he may be removed from his office, after holding enquiry by the Government, if he :ô

- (i) has been found guilty of misuse of power vested under this Act ; or
- (ii) has been convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude ; or
- (iii) fails to attend the proceeding of the tribunal for consecutive four weeks without any valid reasons.

(9) Any vacancy in the Tribunal may be filled by appointment of another person from the panel of names prepared by the selection committee constituted under sub-rule (5).

(10) The non-official members of the Tribunal shall be paid sitting allowance as the Government may determine, but it shall not be less than Rupees Five Hundred per sitting per member.

(11) The Tribunal shall hold its sittings for a minimum of two days a week, which may be increased/decreased by the Government depending on cases and pendency of work.

(12) The Tribunal shall perform the function of adjudicating and disposing off cases of maintenance to achieve the objects of the Act and in this respect shall be guided by the provisions laid down under Chapter II of the Act.

4. Panel for appointment as Conciliation Officers.ô (1) Every Tribunal shall prepare a panel of persons suitable for appointment as Conciliation Officer under sub-section (6) of section 6 of the Act.

(2) The Tribunal shall publish the panel mentioned in sub-rule (1) for general information at least twice every year, on 1st of January and 1st of July, respectively, and incorporate changes, if any, affected therein.

(3) The Conciliation Officers (other than Government employees) may be paid such honorarium and allowances as may be prescribed by the Government.

5. Procedure for filing and application for maintenance and its registration. $\hat{0}$ (1) An application for maintenance under section 4 of the Act shall be made in Form $\div A\phi$, in the manner laid down in clauses (a) and (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Act.

(2) On receipt of an application under sub-rule (1), the Presiding Officer shall cause-its essential details to be entered in a Register of Maintenance Claim Cases, to be maintained by the Maintenance Tribunal, its acknowledgement in Form -Bøto be given, to the applicant or his authorized representative in case of hand delivery, and its dispatch by post in other cases and the acknowledgement shall specify, *inter alia*, the registration number of the application.

(3) Where a Tribunal takes cognizance of a maintenance claim, *suo motu*, the Presiding Officer shall, after ascertaining the facts, get Form $\div A \emptyset$ completed as accurately as possible, get it authenticated by the concerned senior citizen or parent, or any person or organization authorized by him and shall cause the same to be registered in accordance with sub-rule (2) above.

6. **Preliminary scrutiny of the application.**ô (1) On receipt of an application under sub-section (1) of section 5, the Tribunal shall satisfy itself thatô

- (a) The applicant is complete ; and
- (b) the opposite party has, *prima facie*, an obligation to maintain the applicant in terms of section 4 of the Act.

(2) In case, where the Tribunal finds any deficiency in the application, it may direct the applicant to rectify such deficiency within 15 days of filing the application.

(3) Every application shall be heard and decided, within 3 months of the date of its presentation.

7. Notice to the Opposite Party.ô (1) Once the Tribunal is satisfied that application for maintenance is in accordance with the procedure prescribed under the Act and these rules, it shall cause to be issued to each person against whom an application for maintenance has been filed, a notice in Form \div Cø directing them to show cause as to why the maintenance should not be granted, along

- (a) by hand delivery (Dasti) through the applicant, if he so desires, else through a process server ; or
- (b) by registered post with acknowledgement due.

(2) The notice shall require the opposite party to appear in person, on the date to be specified in the notice and to show cause, in writing, as to why the maintenance should not be granted and shall also inform that, in case he fails to respond to it, the Tribunal shall proceed *ex parte*.

(3) Simultaneously with the issuance of notice under sub-rule (1) the applicant(s) shall also be informed of the date mentioned in sub-rule (2), by a notice to be issued in <u>Form 'D'</u>.

(4) The provisions of Order V of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, for the purpose of service of notice under sub-rules (2) and (3).

(5) The Tribunal shall have all the powers of a Civil Court for the purpose of taking evidence on oath and of enforcing the attendance of witnesses and of compelling the discovery and production of documents and material objects and for such other purposes as may be prescribed and the Tribunal shall be deemed to be a Civil Court for all the purposes of section 195 and Chapter XXVI of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

8. Procedure in case of non-appearance by the Opposite **Party.**ô In case, despite service of notice, the opposite party fails to show cause in response to a notice, the Tribunal shall proceed *ex parte*, by taking evidence of the applicant and making such other inquiry as it deems fit and shall thereon pass on order disposing of the application.

9. **Procedure for impleading children or relatives.**ô An application by the opposite party, under the proviso to sub-section (5)

Provided that no such application shall be entertained after such first hearing, unless the opposite party shows sufficient cause for filing it at a later stage.

(2) On receipt of an application under sub-rule (1), the Tribunal shall, if it is *prima facie* satisfied, after hearing the parties, about the reasonableness of such application, issue notice to such other child or relative to show cause why they should not be impleaded as a party, and shall after giving them an opportunity of being heard, pass an order regarding their impleadment or otherwise.

(3) In case the Tribunal passes an order of impleadment under sub-rule (2), it shall cause a notice to be issued to such impleaded party in Form $\div C_{\#}$ in accordance with rule 7.

10. **Reference to Conciliation Officer.**ô (1) In case, on the date fixed in the notice issued under rule 7, the opposite party appears and show cause against the maintenance claim, the Tribunal shall seek the opinion of both the parties as to whether they would like the matter to be referred to a Conciliation Officer and if they express their willingness in this behalf, the Tribunal shall ask them whether they would like the matter to be referred to a person included in the panel prepared under rule 4, or to any other person acceptable to both parties.

(2) If both the parties agree on any person, whether included in the panel under rule 4 or otherwise, the Tribunal shall appoint such person as the Conciliation Officer in the case, and shall refer the matter to him, through a letter in Form $\pm g$, requesting the Conciliation Officer to try and work out a settlement acceptable to both parties, within a period not exceeding one month from the date of receipt of the reference.

(3) The reference in Form $\pm e$ shall be accompanied with copies of the application and replies of the opposite party thereto.

11. Proceedings by Conciliation Officer.ô (1) Upon receipt of a reference under rule 10, the Conciliation Officer shall hold meetings with the two parties as necessary, and shall try to work

(2) If the Conciliation Officer succeeds in working out a settlement acceptable to both the parties, he shall draw up a memorandum of settlement in Form \div Fø, get it signed by both parties, and forward it, with a report in Form \div Gø along with all records of the case received from the Tribunal, back to the Tribunal within a month from the receipt of the reference.

(3) If the Conciliation Officer is unable to arrive at a settlement within one month of receipt of a reference under rule 10, he shall return the papers received from the Tribunal along with a report in Form H showing efforts made to bring about a settlement and the points of difference between the two parties which could not be reconciled.

12. Action by the Tribunal in case of settlement before a Conciliation Officer.ô (1) In case, the Tribunal receives a report from the Conciliation Officer under sub-rule (2) of rule 10, along with a memorandum of settlement, it shall give notice to both parties to appear before it on a date to be specified in the notice, and confirm the settlement.

(2) In case on the date specified in the notice as above, the parties appear before the Tribunal and confirm the settlement arrived at before the Conciliation Officer, the Tribunal shall pass a final order as agreed in such settlement.

13. Action by the Tribunal in other cases.ô (1) In case,ó

- (a) the Applicant(s) and the opposite parties do not agree for reference of their dispute to a Conciliation Officer under sub-rule (1) of rule 10 ; or
- (b) the Conciliation Officer appointed under rule 10 sends a report under sub-rule (3) of rule 11, conveying inability to work out a settlement acceptable to both the parties ; or
- (c) no report is received from a Conciliation Officer within the stipulated time limit of one month ; or

(d) in response to the notice issued sub-rule (1) of rule 12, one or both the parties decline to confirm the settlement worked out by the Conciliation Officer.

The Tribunal shall give to both the parties an opportunity of leading evidence in support of their respective claims, and shall, after a summary inquiry, pass such order as it deems fit.

(2) An order passed under rule 8 or sub-rule (1) above, shall be a speaking one, spelling out the facts of the case as ascertained by the Tribunal and the reasons for such order.

(3) While passing an order under sub-rule (1), directing the opposite party to pay maintenance to an applicant, the Tribunal shall take the following into consideration : \hat{o}

- (a) amount needed by the applicant to meet his basic needs, especially food, clothing, accommodation, and healthcare;
- (b) income of the opposite party ; and
- (c) value of, and actual and potential income from the property, if any, of the applicant which the opposite party would inherit and/or is in possession of.

(4) A copy of every order passed, whether final or interim, on application, shall be given to the applicant(s) and the opposite party or their representatives, in person or shall be sent to them through a process server or by registered post.

14. **Maximum maintenance allowance.**—The maximum maintenance allowance which a Tribunal may by order direct the opposite party to pay shall not exceed Rs. 10000/- per month.

15. Establishment and Procedure of Appellate Tribunal.— The Government shall, by notification in the official Gazette, constitute for each District one Appellate Tribunal, as may be specified in the notification to hear appeal against the order of Tribunal.

16. Form of appeal.—An appeal under sub-section (1) of section 16 shall be filed before the Appellate Tribunal in Form $\exists a$ and shall be accompanied by a copy of the impugned order of the Maintenance Tribunal.

17. Registration and acknowledgement of appeal.—On receipt of an appeal the Appellate Tribunal shall register it in a register to be maintained for the purpose in such form as the Government may direct, and shall, after registering such appeal, give an acknowledgement to the appellant, specifying the appeal number and the next date of hearing, in Form $\because J_{00}$

18. Notice of hearing to the respondent.—(1) On receipt of an appeal, the Appellate Tribunal shall, after registering the case and assigning an appeal number, cause notice to be served upon the respondent under its seal and signature in Form $\pm K \alpha$

(2) The notice under sub-rule (1) shall be issued through registered post with acknowledgement due, or though a process server.

(3) The provisions of Order V of the Civil Procedure Code shall apply *mutatis mutandis* for the purposes of service of notice issued under sub-rule (1).

CHAPTER III

Scheme for Management of old age Homes

19. Scheme for Management of old age Homes established under section 19 of the Act.—(1) Old age homes established under section 19 shall be run in accordance with the following norms and standards :ô

- (A) The home shall have physical facilities and shall be run in accordance with the operational norms as laid down in the Schedule.
- (B) Inmates of the home shall be selected in accordance with the following procedure :ô
 - (a) Applications shall be invited at appropriate intervals, but at least once each year, from indigent senior

citizens, as defined in section 19 of the Act, desirous of living in the home.

- (b) in case the number of eligible applicants on any occasion is more than the number of places available in a home for admission, selection of inmates will be made in the following manner :ô
 - (i) the more indigent and needy will be given preference over the less indigent applicants ;
 - (ii) other things being equal, older senior citizens will be given preference over the less old ; and
 - (iii) other things being equal, female applicants will be given preference over male applicants.

Illiterate and/or very infirm senior citizens may also be admitted without any formal application if the competent authority, is satisfied that the senior citizen is not a position to make a formal application, but is badly in need of shelter ;

- (c) While considering applications or cases for admission, no distinction shall be made on the basis of religion or caste ;
- (d) The home shall provide separate lodging for men and women inmates, unless a male and a female inmate are either blood relations or a married couple and endeavour shall be made to accommodate the married couple as far as possible ; and
- (e) Day-to-day affairs of the old age home shall be managed by a Management Committee, which shall include inmates also, so as to suitably represent on the Committee.

(2) The Government may issue detailed guidelines/orders from time to time for admission into and management of old age homes in accordance with the norms and standards laid down in sub-rule (1) and constitute and operate a Fund for the welfare of Senior Citizens as may be prescribed.

Duties and Powers

20. Duties and powers of the Deputy Commissioner.— (1) The Deputy Commissioner shall perform the duties and exercise such powers as mentioned in sub-rules (2) and (3) so as to ensure that the provisions of the Act are properly carried out in the district.

- (2) It shall be duty of the Deputy Commissioner toô
 - (i) ensure that life and property of senior citizens of the district are protected and they are able to live with security and dignity ;
- (ii) oversee and monitor the work of Maintenance Tribunals and Maintenance Officers of the district with a view to ensuring timely and fair disposal of applications for maintenance and execution of *:*Tribunalsø orders ;
- (iii) oversee and monitor the working of old age homes in the district so as to ensure that they confirm to the standards laid down in these rules and any other guidelines and orders of the Government;
- (iv) ensure regular and wide publicity of the provisions of the Act, and Central and Government(s) programmes for the welfare of senior citizens ;
- (v) encourage and coordinate with municipalities, educational institutions and especially their National Service Scheme Units, organizations, specialists, experts, activists, etc. working in the district so that their resources and efforts are effectively pooled for the welfare of senior citizens of the district ;
- (vi) ensure provisions of timely assistance and relief to senior citizens in the event of natural calamities and other district;
- (vii) ensure periodic sensitization of officers of various Departments and Local Bodies concerned with welfare of senior citizens towards the needs of such citizens, and the duties of the officers towards the latter ;

- (viii) ensure that adequate number of prescribed application forms for maintenance are available in Offices of common contact or citizens like Post Offices, SDMs Offices, District Offices, PDS Outlets, Police Stations, etc. ;
- (ix) perform such other functions as the Government may, by order, assign to the Deputy Commissioners in this behalf from time to time.

(3) With a view to performing the duties mentioned in sub-rule (2), the Deputy Commissioners shall be competent to issue such directions, not inconsistent with the Act, these rules, and general guidelines of the Government, as may be necessary, to any concerned Government or statutory agency or body working in the district, and especially to the following : \hat{o}

- (i) Officers of the Government in the Police, Health and Publicity Department, and Department dealing with welfare of senior citizens ;
- (ii) Maintenance Tribunals and Conciliation Officers ;
- (iii) Urban Local Bodies and Panchayats of Jammu and Kashmir ; and
- (iv) Educational institutions.

CHAPTER V

Protection of Life and Property

21. Action plan for the protection of life and property of senior citizens.—(1) The Director General, Police shall take all necessary steps, subject to such guidelines as the Government may issue from time to time for the protection of life and property of senior citizens.

- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of sub-rule (1)ô
 - (i) each Police Station shall maintain an up-to-date list of senior citizens living within its jurisdiction, especially those who are living by themselves (i. e. without there being any member in their household who is not a senior citizen);

- (ii) a representative of the Police Station together, as far as possible, with a social worker of volunteer, shall visit such senior citizens at regular intervals and shall, in addition, visit them as quickly as possible on receipt of a request of assistance from them ;
- (iii) complaints/problems of senior citizens shall be promptly attended to, by the local police ;
- (iv) one or more Volunteersø Committee(s) shall be formed for each police station which shall ensure regular contact between the senior citizens, especially those living by themselves on the one hand, and the police and district administration on the other.
- (v) Inspector General of Police concerned shall cause to be published widely in the media and through the police stations, at regular intervals, the steps being taken for the protection of life and property of senior citizens.
- (vi) each police station shall maintain a separate register containing all important particulars relating to offences committed against senior citizens, in such form as the Government may, by order, specify.
- (vii) the register referred to in clause (vi) shall be kept available for public inspection, and every officer inspecting a police station shall invariably review the status as reflected in the register.
- (viii) The police station shall send a monthly report of such crimes to the District Superintendent of Police, by the 10th of every month.
- (ix) list of Doøs and Donøts to be followed by senior citizens in the interest of their safety will be widely publicized.
- (x) antecedents of domestic servants and other working for senior citizens shall be promptly verified on the request of such citizens.
- (xi) community policing for the security of senior citizens will be undertaken in conjunction with citizens living in the neighborhood Residentsø Welfare Association. Youth Volunteers, Non-Government Organizations, etc.;

(xii) District Superintendent of Police shall submit to the Inspector General of Police, a monthly report by the 20th of every month, about the status of crime against senior citizens during the previous month, including progress of investigation and prosecution of registered offences, and preventive steps taken during the month. The Inspector General of Police shall cause the reports to be complied, once a quarter, and shall submit them to the Government every quarter as well as every year for, *inter alia* being placed before the Union Territory Council of Senior Citizens constituted under rule 22.

CHAPTER VI

Union Territory Council and District Committees of Senior Citizens

22. Union Territory Council of Senior Citizens.—(1) The Government may, by order, establish a Union Territory Council of Senior Citizens to advice the Government on effective implementation of the Act and to perform such other functions in relation to senior citizens as the Government may specify.

(2) The Union Territory Council shall consist of the following members, namely :ô

- (i) Minister of the Government in charge of welfare of senior citizens/Social Welfare Department ;
- (ii) Administrative Secretaries of Department of the Government dealing with Social Welfare, Health, Finance, Home, GAD and other subject of concern to the senior citizens;
- (iii) Director General of Police, Divisional Commissioner, Jammu/ Kashmir, Inspector General of Police, Jammu/Kashmir;
- (iv) such members of specialists and activists in the field of welfare of senior citizens, as the Government may determine, to be nominated by the Government ;
- (v) such number of eminent senior citizens, as the Government may determine, but not less in number than the ex-officio members in the Council, to be nominated by the Government ; and

(3) The Union Territory Council shall meet at least once in every six months.

(4) The tenure of the members of the Union Territory Council, other than ex-officio members, will be three years, which will be conterminous with the term of the Council.

23. **District Committee.**—(1) The Government may, by order, establish a District Committee of Senior Citizens for each district to advise in effective and coordinated implementation of the Act at district level, and to perform such other functions in relation to senior citizens at the district level, as the Government may, specify.

(2) The District Committee shall meet at least once in every four months.

(3) The composition of the District Committee, tenure of members (other than ex-officio Members), rules of procedure and other ancillary matters shall be such as the Government may, by order, specify.

Norms of physical facilities and operational standards for and Old Age Home for indigent Senior Citizens established under section 19 of the Act

I. Physical Facilities :

- 1. Land : The land for the old age home should be adequate to comply with the Floor Area Ratio (FAR) as prescribed by the relevant urban body/Government. In the case of semiurban/rural areas, the Government shall provide adequate land for setting up of an old age home of requisite capacity such that there is adequate land for recreation, gardening, further expansion, etc.
- 2. Living Space : The old age home shall, as far as possible, have minimum area per inmate as per the following norms :ô
 - (i) area of bedroom/dormitory per inmate 7.5 sq. meters ;
 - (ii) living area or carpet area per inmate i. e. including (i) above plus ancillary areas like kitchen, dining hall, recreation room, medical room, etc. but excluding verandahs, corridors, etc. 12 sq. meters.
- 3. Facilities : (1) The old age home shall have the following facilities :ô
 - a. residential area comprising rooms/dormitories-separately for men and women ;
 - b. adequate water for drinking and ancillary purposes ;
 - c. electricity, fans and heating arrangement for inmates (as necessary) ;
 - d. kitchen-cum-store and office ;
 - e. dining hall ;

- f. adequate number of toilets and baths, including toilets suitable for disabled persons ;
- g. Recreation facilities, television, newspaper and an adequate collection of books ; and (VIII) first aid sick bay, and primary healthcare facilities
- h. The old age home should be barrier-free with provision of ramps and handrails, and where necessary, lifts, etc.

II. Operational Standards :

- (1) Supply of nutritious and wholesome diet as per scale to be fixed by the UT Government.
- (2) Adequate clothing and linen for the inmates, including for the winter season.
- (3) Adequate arrangements for sanitation, hygiene, and watch and ward/security.
- (4) Arrangements with the nearest Government hospital for emergency medical care, and with the nearest Police Station for security requirements.

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ACHABAL MUNICIPAL COMMITTEE, PLASTIC WASTE MANAGEMENT BYE-LAWS, 2020.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6, 8 and 25 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986), the Government of India have notified the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 to regulate the management of Plastic Waste.

And whereas, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 6(4) of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, the Achabal Municipal Committee hereby frames the following Bye-laws :ô

The Bye-laws are governed by all the activities related to plastics as amended from time to time by Government of India, Government of Jammu and Kashmir, Central Pollution Control Board, J&K State Pollution Control Board and other related statutory organizations and their acts and laws.

ACHABAL MUNICIPAL COMMITTEE

PLASTIC WASTE MANAGEMENT BYE-LAWS, 2020.

1. **Title**.ô This shall be called as the Achabal Municipal Committee, Plastic Waste Management Bye-laws-2020.

2. Extent of application.ô The Bye-Laws apply to every waste generator, manufacturer, producer, dealer, agents, importers and exporters within the limits of Municipal Committee, Achabal.

3. **Definition**.ô In this Bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,ô

- "Act" means the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (29 of 1986);
- (2) **"alternate use"** means use of a material for a purpose other than for which it was conceived, which is beneficial because it promotes resource efficiency ;
- (3) **"brand owner"** means a person or company who sells any commodity under a registered brand label ;
- (4) "bulk waste generator" means and includes buildings occupied by the Central Government Departments or undertakings, State Government Departments or undertakings, local bodies, public sector undertakings or private companies, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, colleges, universities, other educational institutions, hostels, hotels, commercial establishments, markets, places of worship, stadia and sports complexes having an average waste generation rate exceeding 100 kg. per day;
- (5) **"Bye-laws"** means Achabal Municipal Committee, Plastic Waste Management Bye-laws, 2020;
- (6) (a) "carry bags" means bags made from plastic material, used for the purpose of carrying or dispensing commodities which have a self-carrying feature but do not include bags that constitute or form an integral part of the packaging in which goods are sealed prior to use. These are banned as per G. O. (Ms) No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department dated 25-06-2018 ;
 - (b) "**carry bags**" means bags made from compostable plastic material, used for the purpose of carrying or dispensing

- (7) **"commodity"** means tangible item that may be bought or sold and includes all marketable goods or wares ;
- (8) "compostable plastics" mean plastic that undergoes degradation by biological processes during composting to yield CO₂, water, inorganic compounds and biomass at a rate consistent with other known compostable materials, excluding conventional petro-based plastics, and does not leave visible, distinguishable or toxic residue ;
- (9) "consent" means the consent to establish and operate from Jammu and Kashmir State Pollution Control Board granted under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (6 of 1974), and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 (14 of 1981);
- (10) **"disintegration"** means the physical breakdown of a material into very small fragments ;
- (11) **"energy recovery"** means energy recovery from waste that is conversion of waste material into useable heat, electricity or fuel through a variety of processes including combustion, gasification, pyrolisation, anaerobic digestion and landfill gas recovery ;
- (12) **"event"** means any gathering for the purpose of functions, celebrations, meetings, rallies, processions, open air theatre activities, cinema shootings in public places etc. ;
- (13) **"extended producer's responsibility"** means the responsibility of a producer for the environmentally sound management of the product until the end of its life ;
- (14) **"food-stuffs"** mean ready to eat food products, fast food, processed or cooked food in liquid, powder, solid or semi-solid form ;
- (15) **"facility"** means the premises used for collection, storage, recycling, processing and disposal of plastic waste ;

- (16) **"Importer"** means a person who imports or intends to import and holds an Importer-Exporter Code Number, unless otherwise specifically exempted ;
- (17) **"Institutional waste generator"** means and includes occupier of the institutional buildings such as building occupied by Central Government Departments, State Government Departments, public or private sector companies, hospitals, schools, colleges, universities or other places of education, organization, academy, hotels restaurants, malls and shopping complexes ;
- (18) **"Local Body"** for the purpose of these Bye-laws means Municipal Committee, Achabal ;
- (19) **"manufacturer"** means and includes a person or unit or agency engaged in production of plastic raw material to be used as raw material by the producer ;
- (20) **"multilayered packaging"** means any material used or to be used for packaging and having at least one layer of plastic as the main ingredients in combination with one or more layers of materials such as paper, paper board, polymeric materials, metalized layers or aluminium foil, either in the form of a laminate or co-extruded structure ;
- (21) "Nuisance Detectors" (NDs) means those employees of the Municipal Committee, Achabal who are appointed by the Executive Officer to detect the acts of nuisance etc. related to plastic waste management ;
- (22) **"plastic"** means material which contains as an essential ingredient a high polymer, such as polyethylene terephthalate, high density polyethylene, Vinyl, low density polyethylene, polypropylene, polystyrene resins, multi-materials like acrylonitrile butadiene styrene, polyphenylene oxide, polycarbonate, polybutylene terephthalate etc. ;
- (23) "plastic sheet" means plastic sheet is the sheet made of plastic, which are banned as per G. O. (Ms) No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department dated 25-06-2018;

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- (24) **"plastic waste"** means any plastic discarded after use or after their intended use is over ;
- (25) **"Prescribed authority"** means the authorities specified in clause 12 of Plastic Waste Management and Handling Rules, 2016, and Executive Officer of Municipal Committee, Achabal ;
- (26) **"producer"** means persons engaged in manufacture or import of carry bags or multilayered packaging or plastic sheets or like, and includes industries or individuals using plastic sheets or like or covers made of plastic sheets or multilayered packaging for packaging or wrapping the commodity;
- (27) **"recycling"** means the process of transforming segregated plastic waste into a new product or raw material for producing new products ;
- (28) **"registration"** means registration with the J&K State Pollution Control Board or Municipal Committee, Achabal or statutory authority concerned, as the case may be ;
- (29) "street vendor" shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in clause (1) of sub-section (l) of Section 2 of the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 (7 of 2014);
- (30) "use and throwaway plastics" this definition is adopted from G. O. No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department which means items such as plastic carry bags or plastic flags, plastic sheets used for food wrapping, spreading on dining table etc. plastic plates, plastic coated tea cups and plastic tumbler, water pouches and packets, plastic straw irrespective of thickness as defined in G. O. No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department dated 25-06-2018 are banned as follows :ô
 - (a) The plastic sheets used for the food wrapping, spreading on dining table, etc.ô
 - i. Plastic sheet/cling film used for food wrapping ;
 - Plastic/plastic coated sheet used for spreading on dining table ;

- (b) Plastic platesô
 - (i) Plastic thermocol plates ;
 - (ii) Plastic coated paper plates ;
- (c) Plastic coated tea cups and plastic tumblerô
 - (i) Plastic coated paper cups ;
 - (ii) Plastic tea cups ;
 - (iii) Plastic tumbler ;
 - (iv) Thermocol cups ;
- (d) Water pouches and packets ;
- (e) Plastic straw ;
- (f) Plastic carry bags and plastic flagsô
 - (i) Plastic carry bags of all size and thickness ;
 - (ii) Plastic coated carry bags ;
 - (iii) Non-woven polypropylene carry bags ;
- (31) **"virgin plastic**" means plastic material which has not been subjected to use earlier and has also not been blended with scrap or waste ;
- (32) **"waste generator"** means and includes every person or group of persons or institutions, residential, and commercial establishments including Indian Railways, Airport, Port and Harbour and Defence establishments, places of worship which generate plastic waste ;
- (33) **"waste management"** means the collection, storage, transportation reduction, re-use, recovery, recycling, composting or disposal of plastic waste in an environmentally safe manner ;
- (34) **"Waste pickers"** means individuals or agencies, groups of individuals voluntarily engaged or authorized for picking of recyclable plastic waste.

4. **Conditions**.ô (1) The manufacturer, importer, stocking, distribution, sale and use of plastic shall be subject to the following conditions, namely :ô

- (a) Plastic packaging shall either be in natural shade which is without any pigments or made using only those pigments and colorants which are in conformity with Indian Standard : IS 9833 : 1981 titled as õList of pigments and colorants for use in plastics in contact with food-stuffs, pharmaceuticals and drinking waterö as amended from time to time ;
- (b) Products made of recycled plastics shall not be used for storing, carrying, dispensing or packaging ready to eat or drink stuffs;
- (c) Plastic sheet or like, which is not an integral part of Multilayered packaging and cover made of plastic sheet used for packaging, wrapping the commodity shall not be less than fifty microns in thickness except whether thickness of such plastic sheets impair the functionality of the product ;
- (d) The manufacturer shall not sell or provide or arrange plastic to be used as raw material to a producer, not having valid registration from J&K State Pollution Control Board;
- (e) Sachets using plastic material shall not be used for storing, packing or selling gutkha, pan masala and tobacco;
- (f) Plastic material, in any form including Vinyl Acetate-Maleic Acid-Vinyl Chloride Copolymer, shall not be used in any package for packaging gutkha, pan masala and tobacco in all forms;
- (g) Recycling of plastic waste shall conform to the Indian Standard : IS 14534 : 1998 titled as õGuidelines for Recycling of Plasticsö, as amended from time to time ;
- (h) The provision of thickness shall not be applicable to carry bags made up of compostable plastics. Carry bags made from compostable plastics bearing a label õcompostableö shall conform to the Indian Standard : IS 17088 : 2008 titled as Specifications for õCompostable Plasticsö. The manufacturer or seller of compostable plastic carry bags shall obtain a

5. **Plastic waste management**.ô (1) The plastic waste management by Municipal Committee, Achabal in its jurisdiction shall be as under :ô

- (a) Plastic waste, which can be recycled, shall be channelized to registered plastic waste recycler and recycling of plastic shall conform to the Indian Standard : IS 14534 : 1998 titled as Guidelines for Recycling of Plastics, as amended from time to time ;
- (b) Plastic waste, which cannot be recycled, shall be channelized to Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF) plants/cement plants/pyrolysis plants or any other technologies. The standards and pollution control norms specified by the prescribed authority for these technologies shall be complied with ;
- (c) Municipal Committee, Achabal shall encourage the use of plastic waste (preferably the plastic waste which cannot be further recycled) for road construction as per Indian Road Congress guidelines;
- (d) Thermoset plastic waste shall be processed and disposed of as per the guidelines issued from time to time by the Central Pollution Control Board ; and
- (e) The inert from recycling or processing facilities of plastic waste shall be disposed of in compliance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 or as amended from time to time.

6. **Responsibilities of Municipal Committee, Achabal.**— (1) The Municipal Committee, Achabal shall be responsible for development and setting up of infrastructure for segregation, collection, storage, transportation, processing and disposal of the plastic waste either on its own or by engaging agencies or producers.

(2) The Municipal Committee, Achabal shall be responsible for setting up, operationalization and coordination of the waste management system and for performing the associated functions, namely :ô

(a) Ensuring segregation, collection, storage, transportation, processing and disposal of plastic waste ;

- (b) Ensuring that no damage is caused to the environment during this process ;
- (c) Ensuring channelization of recyclable plastic waste fraction to recyclers ;
- (d) Ensuring processing and disposal of non-recyclable fraction of plastic waste in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Central Pollution Control Board;
- (e) Creating awareness among all stakeholders about their responsibilities;
- (f) Engaging civil societies or groups working with waste pickers ; and
- (g) Ensuring that open burning of plastic waste does not take place.

(3) The Municipal Committee, Achabal shall seek assistance of producers and setup a system of plastic waste management as per of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, or any other relevant law amended from time to time.

(4) The Municipal Committee, Achabal shall endeavour and encourageô

- a. Civil society organizations involved in plastic eradication in order to implement Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 and these Bye-laws;
- b. Self Help Groups (SHG) is involved for segregation of waste processing. It may be encouraged for the purpose of technical guidance as well as implementation through appropriate organizations.

(5) Municipal Committee, Achabal shall extend the Slum Adoption Program to the uncovered areas within their wards for solid waste management and plastic waste management, with the possible assistance of qualified Community Based Organizations (CBOs)/Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)/Voluntary Service Organizations (VSOs)/Self Help Groups (SHG) or other organizations holding statutory validations ;

(6) Cleanliness drives will be conducted by the Municipal Committee, Achabal in association with public representatives, citizen organizations,

7. **Responsibilities of waste generator**.ô (1) The waste generator shall,ô

- (a) Not use plastic items banned under G. O. No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department ;
- (b) Take steps to minimize generation of plastic waste and segregate plastic waste at source in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, and in accordance with the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 and amendments made in these rules from time to time ;
- (c) Not litter or burn the plastic waste, and ensure segregated storage of waste at source and handover segregated waste to Greater Chennai Corporation or agencies appointed by them or registered recyclers.

(2) All institutional generators of plastic waste, shall segregate and store the waste generated by them in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, as amended from time to time and handover segregated wastes to authorized waste processing or disposal facilities or deposition centers either on its own or through the authorized waste collection agency once in a week on Wednesday or any other designated day or periodically as specified from time to time.

(3) All the waste generator shall pay integrated user fee for plastic waste management, which is included in the solid waste management user fee as per Achabal Municipal Committee Solid Waste Management Bye-Laws, 2019.

(4) Every person responsible for organizing an event in open space, which involves service of food stuff in plastic or multilayered packaging shall segregate and manage the waste generated during such events in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Achabal Municipal Committee Solid Waste Management Bye-Laws, 2019. Further, the organizers shall pay the user fee prescribed for events in open public places ; and

(5) All bulk waste generators shall install and maintain Reverse Vending Machine or any other appropriate system of recycling PET

8. **Responsibilities of Producers, Importers and Brand Owners**.ô (1) Primary responsibility for collection of used multilayered plastic sachet or pouches or packaging is of Producers, Importers and Brand Owners, who introduce the products in the market, they need to establish a system for collecting back the plastic waste generated due to their products. This plan of collection is to be submitted to the Jammu and Kashmir Pollution Control Board while applying for consent to Establish or Operate or Renewal. The Brand Owners, whose consent has been renewed before the notification of these rules, shall submit such plan within one year from the date of notification of these Bye-laws.

(2) The producers shall work out modalities for waste collection system based on Extended Producers Responsibility and inform Municipal Council, Achabal accordingly within 4 months from the notification of Plastic Waste Management Bye-Laws, 2020.

(3) Multilayered plastic which is non-recyclable or non-energy recoverable or with no alternate use of plastic shall not be used in Municipal Committee, Achabal limits.

(4) All producers shall submit an application to the J&K State Pollution Control Board for grant of registration, for production of plastics ; and

(5) No producer shall use any plastic or multilayered packaging for packaging of commodities without registration from the J&K State Pollution Control Board.

9. **Protocols for compostable plastic materials**.ô Determination of the degree of degradability and degree of disintegration of plastic material shall be as per the protocols of the Indian Standards listed in Schedule-III of these Bye-laws.

10. Marking or labelling. \hat{o} (1) Each carry bag made from compostable plastics, and multilayered packaging shall have the following information printed in <u>English mandatorily</u> and any number of other languages as optional, namely : \hat{o}

(a) Name and registration number of the manufacturer in case of multilayered packaging ; and

> (b) Name of the manufacturer and certificate number [4(g) of these Bye-laws] in case of carry bags made from compostable plastics.

(2) Each carry bag made from compostable plastics shall bear a label õcompostableö and shall conform to the Indian Standard : IS or ISO 17088 : 2008 titled as Specifications for õCompostable Plasticsö and also the Central Pollution Control Board License Number shall be mentioned.

11. **Registration of producer, recyclers and manufacturers**.ô No person shall manufacture carry bags made from compostable plastics/ multilayered packaging without obtaining registration with J&K State Pollution Control Board within Municipal Committee, Achabal limits.

12. **Responsibilities of retailers and street vendors**.ô (1) Retailers or street vendors shall not sell or provide commodities to consumer in carry bags made with compostable plastics or multilayered packaging, which are not manufactured and labelled or marked, as prescribed under the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, and Plastic Waste Management Bye-laws, 2020.

(2) Every retailer or street vendor selling or providing commodities in carry bags made with compostable plastics or multilayered packaging which are not manufactured or labelled or marked in accordance with these Bye-laws shall be liable to pay such fines as specified under the Bye-laws listed in Schedule-I.

13. Penalties for contravention of these Bye-laws.ô (1) Whosoever contravention any of provisions of these Bye-laws shall be punishable with fines as per the Schedule of Fines (Schedule-I) for every instance of breach of these Bye-laws. Subsequent contravention apart from first time will attract fine amount of minimum two times to maximum ten times for each and every act of offence.

14. Enforcement mechanism for Municipal Committee, Achabal.ô (1) The Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal shall be the authority for enforcement of the provisions of these rules relating to plastic waste management by waste generator.

(2) The Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal shall take the assistance of the Deputy Commissioner within the territorial limits of the jurisdiction of the Municipal Committee, Achabal in the enforcement of the provisions of these Bye-laws.

(3) **Periodical and Surprise checks** : The Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal or any other officer as authorized by the Executive Officer, will conduct surprise checks in various parts of the wards in the Municipal Committee, Achabal limits at any point of time to enforce compliance of the Bye-laws. Any contravention of any clause of this Bye-law shall attract a fine as per Schedule-I of the Bye-laws.

15. Ban on one time use and throw away plastics.ô (1) As per G. O. (Ms) No. 84 Environment and Forests (EC.2) Department dated 25-06-2018, the Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal shall enforce the direction of õone time use throwaway plastic banö in exercise of power conferred on him/her by law in their jurisdiction :ô

- (a) No industry or person shall manufacture, store, supply, transport, sale or distribute, -use and throwaway plasticsø as described in the definition ;
- (b) No person including shopkeeper, vendor, wholesaler, retailer, trader, hawker or salesmen shall use, -use and throwaway plasticsø:

Provided that the plastic used for the following purposes are exempted :ô

- (i) The plastic carry bags, manufactured exclusively for export purpose against any export order in a plastic industry located in Special Economic Zone (SEZ) and Export Oriented Units (EOU);
- (ii) The plastic bags which constitute or form an integral part of packaging in which goods are sealed prior to use at manufacturing/processing units;
- (iii) The plastic bags and sheets used in Forestry and Horticulture nurseries against the orders from the Government Departments;
- (iv) The plastic used for packing of milk and milk products (dairy products), oil, medicine and medical equipments.

(2) Enforcement mechanism for ban on one time use and throwaway plastics is as follows :ô

(a) **Periodical and Surprise checks** : The Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal or any other Officer as

17. Jurisdiction of Courts.ô For filing cases against the Bye-laws, the jurisdiction is Achabal only.

- 18. Miscellaneous provisions.ô
 - (a) The Executive Officer may appoint or designate any individuals or agencies to assist in connection with enforcement and implementation of these Bye-Laws.

19. Any person or persons aggrieved or affected by Achabal Municipal Committee Plastic Waste Management Bye-Laws, 2020 shall have the right to submit his/her grievances to Nodal Officer on Plastic Waste Management. If he/she is not satisfied with the decision of Nodal Officer, he/she may appeal to the Executive Officer, Municipal Committee, Achabal.
