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District Collector (Deputy Commissioner), Reasi, was requested by the Officer Commanding 58RCC GREF C/o 56 APO in a letter of formal

indent bearing No. 2004/RSPR/F-71/67/E2 dated 08-10-2009, for the acquisition of land for public purpose namely õConstruction/impvt. of Road Reasi-Pouni-Siar-Rajouri to NHDL specification between Km 27.700 to 29.725 at Village Kheralairö, Tehsil Pouni, District Reasi. The case was referred to this Collectorate for initiating land acquisition proceedings under the provisions of Land Acquisition Act, 1990 Svt. and rules made thereunder. The revenue papers were got prepared through Tehsildar, Pouni and also got authenticated by the Indenting Department.

Accordingly, a notification under section 4(1) of Land Acquisition Act No. X Svt. 1990 was issued by this Collectorate vide No. COL/ LA/ADC/Rsi/19-20/72-79/NSQ dated 13-9-2019 and was served upon the land owners/interested persons and Indenting Department, who were asked to file their objections, if any, within 15 days from the date of issuance of said notification. No objection was received by the Collectorate in response to said notification. Thereafter, this Collectorate vide No. COL/LA/ADC/Rsi/19-20/133-36/NSQ dated 04-10-2019 submitted the case to the District Collector (Deputy Commissioner), Reasi for obtaining declaration under sections 6 & 7 of the Land Acquisition Act, 1990 Svt., from the competent authority. The District Collector (Deputy Commissioner), Reasi vide No. DC/Rsi/19-20/233-37/ SQ dated 12-10-2019, submitted the case to the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu for the issuance of declaration under sections 6 & 7 of the Land Acquisition Act. The Revenue Department vide Notification No. 272-Rev (LAJ) of 2019 dated 25-10-2019 issued declaration under sections 6 & 7 of the Act.

Thereafter, a notification under sections 9 & 9A of the Land Acquisition Act was issued by this Collectorate vide No. Coll/ADC/Rsi/20-21/126-34 dated 08-10-2020, and was served upon the land owners/interested persons and Indenting Department asking them to file their objections regarding measurement, title and quantum of compensation within a stipulated period. In response to said notification, no objection was received from anyone concerned.

PRINCIPLE OF COMPENSATION

This land is located in Village Kheralair, Tehsil Pouni and is being acquired for GREF for public purpose i. e. õConstruction/impvt. of road Reasi-Pouni-Siar-Rajouri to NHDL specification between Km 27.700 to

29.725 at Village Kheralairö, Tehsil Pouni, District Reasi. Tehsildar, Pouni at the time of preparation of revenue papers worked out three years (2012-2015) average sale deed to be Rs.1,25,000/- per local Kanal and recommended the present market rate as Rs. 1.35 lacs for irrigation and Rs. 1.25 lacs for unirrigated, per local kanal for Village Kheralair. The stamp duty rates for the year 2019 notified by the Chairperson, District Valuation Committee, Reasi vide No. DC/Rsi/18-19/1529-57/SQ dated 31-12-2018 of Village Kheralair, Tehsil Pouni, District Reasi are Rs. 2.30 (in lacs) for irrigated, Rs. 1.96 (in lacs) for unirrigated and Rs. 3.45 (in lacs) for small plots, per local kanal. It is pertinent to mention here that the land measuring 03 Kanals 04 Marlas at Village Kheralair, Tehsil Pouni @ Rs. 2.50 lacs for BQ/GM per local kanal, has been acquired for PMGSY road for which Collectors meeting was held on 01-10-2019.

Therefore, keeping in view the report of field staff, location of land, notified stamp duty rates for the year of 2019 and earlier land acquisition in the village, this Collectorate proposed a rate of Rs. 3.45 lacs per local kanal for cultivable land and Rs. 3.00 lacs per local kanal for uncultivable land. Besides, Jabrana @ 15% as admissible under rules will be paid to the land owners/interested persons. Accordingly the draft award was issued by this Collectorate vide No. COL/ADC/Rsi/20-21/ 187 dated 06-02-2021 and same was put up in the meeting of Collectors held on 08-02-2021 headed by the District Collector, Reasi, wherein the committee of Collectors after thorough discussion determined the rates as proposed by this Collectorate i. e. Rs. 3.45 Lakh per local kanal for cultivable land and Rs.3.00 Lakh per local kanal for uncultivable land in the meeting, minutes of which are communicated to this Collectorate vide No. DC/Rsi/20-21/2006-12/SQ dated 18-02-2021. Thereafter, this Collectorate vide No. COL/ADC/Rsi/20-21/194-95 dated 22-2-2021 prepared the revised draft award and submitted the same to the District Collector, Reasi for the approval of rates of land compensation and sanction of awarded amount. The District Collector, Reasi vide No. DC/Rsi/20-21/2070-73/SQ dated 24-02-2021 accorded the approval of rates of land compensation and sanction of awarded amount in the light of provisions of SRO-132 of 2019 dated 25-2-2019 issued by the Revenue Department, J&K Govt. No structure/trees have beeen reported to be involved in the instant acquisition.

SO-275.óóThe Excise Policy 2020-21 enunciated as hereunder will come into force on 1st September, 2020 and will continue to remain in force till 31st March, 2021. However, the Government of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir may revisit and revise the same at any point during the course of the year.

- 1. **Policy Objectives**.ô In supersession of the earlier Policy and with a view to providing equal rights to the existing license and sub-license holders, the Excise Policy 2020-21 is announced with the following objectives:ô
 - i. To rationalize the number of taxes, duties and other levies to optimize revenues for common good ;
 - ii. To bring about greater social consciousness about the harmful effects of consumption of liquor and alcoholic beverages;
 - iii. To Encourage transition from high to low alcoholic content beverages;
 - iv. To check bootlegging/smuggling of Bottled in Origin (BIO) brands in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir from neighboring states/union territories;
 - v. To provide choice of brands and adequate places for consumption to its consumers and a level playing field to those in this business.

In addition to these, the Department shall continue to issue Permitsø to serve liquor on social occasions at private places, banquet halls, party halls and restaurants etc. on payment of fee prescribed in para 13.

3. Issuance of Licenses:

3.1 Wholesale trade

The licenses for wholesale trade shall be issued as per the provisions of J&K Excise Act, Svt. 1958, and rules framed thereunder. The licensee holding JKEL-IA license shall be allowed to import liquor from any of its own distilleries or the distilleries with which it has a valid agreement to produce or bottle liquor on its behalf, located outside the state, subject to the condition that fee of Rs. 5.00 lac or as revised from time to time is paid in full for each source.

3.2. Retail trade:

- 3.2.1. The grant of licenses for operating liquor vends shall be strictly in accordance with the provisions of the ±J&K Excise Act, Svt.1958ø and rules framed thereunder.
- 3.2.2. The Excise Commissioner shall grant new licenses for retail sale of liquor on the premises viz. JKEL-3, JKEL-3A, JKEL-4, JKEL-4C-JKEL-5, JKEL-5A, JKEL-7, JKEL-7A, JKEL-7B, JKEL-7C, JKEL-7D etc. as per the provisions of -J&K Excise Act, Svt. 1958ø, and -J&K Liquor License and Sale Rules, 1984ø at the locations as he/she may deem fit keeping in view the demand potential of the area and to provide adequate places for consumption to its consumers. Objective and transparent procedures relating to renewal/transfer/cancellation of licenses shall be adopted/followed by the Excise Department. Similarly, the penal provisions as stipulated in the relevant Act/rules shall be objectively and transparently followed by the department in the event of deviations by the licensees from the laid down framework.

Micro-brewery (JKEL-7D):

To encourage transition from high to low alcohol content beverages, the department shall issue License for Bar with Micro Brewery at the locations permitted by the Excise Commissioner. Detailed guidelines in this regard shall be issued separately by the Excise Commissioner with the approval of the Government.

- 3.2.3 **JKEL-2**: In order to arrest bootlegging, illicit distillation of liquor and to ensure availability of safe drinks, the Excise Department may grant new licenses for sale of liquor of the premises (JKEL-2; wine shops), as per the Æxcise Act, Svt., 1958ø and the rules framed there under, in un-served and under-served areas for which the Excise department shall conduct a survey and prepare a list of such areas. Locations for new vends shall be properly identified in consultation with all the stakeholders and in due deference to the rules prescribed such as distance from religious places etc. The allotment of vends in these areas shall be made through e-tendering process in a secure and transparent manner as per GFRs. Provided that while granting new Licenses, the department shall earmark fixed number of Licenses or the Licensed zones, as the case may be, for Ex-Servicemen, Specially abled SC/ST/OBC and economically weaker sections. The criteria of allotment of liquor vends to each of the above category shall be as under :ô
 - (i) 12% of the total liquor vends (JKEL-2) to be auctioned at any time in future is proposed to be earmarked/set aside for these categories. Within the overall ceiling of 12% quota, each of these six categories may be assigned 2% quota of auctionable liquor vends.
 - (ii) In the proposed arrangement, auction of liquor vends shall be held exclusively for each of these categories. In case the number of auctionable liquor vends is less than 50, there shall be no category-wise auctions for allotment of vends and each category shall participate in a composite auction to be held for 12% quota set aside for these categories.
 - (iii) Further, in case where the number of auctionable vends is such that they canot be assigned in equal numbers/uniformly to each category, then too the extent the no. of auctionable vends can be equally distributed amongst each category, such vends shall be put to auction category-wise and for any surplus vends (s), a composite auction shall be held for all the reserve categories. For instance, if the total No. of auctionable vends is 50 and 12% of quota for these categories works out to 6, then one vend each shall be put to auction category-wise. However, if number of auctionable vends is 51, then one vend each out of 6 allotable vends shall be put to category-wise auction and for the reminder vend, there shall be a composite auction held for all the reserve categories. Further, in composite auction for reserved categories, roster shall be maintained to ensure equity

4. Grant of license to Manufacturing/Bottling plant:

Grant of License for Distilleries, Breweries and Bottling Plants shall as per the provisions of $\pm J\&K$ Excise Act, Svt, 1958ø and rules framed thereunder.

A non-refundable sum of Rs. 25.00 Lacs shall be charged for issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI) for setting up Distilleries, Breweries and Bottling Plants.

5. Fixation of Maximum Retail Price:

The Maximum Retail Price (MRP) of all types of Liquor including JK Special whisky and Beer shall continue to be fixed by the Excise Commissioner for the year 2020-21 on recommendations of the Price Fixation Committee, after factoring in all the applicable duties on the EDP/EBP.

Any increase in the EDP/EBP over the previous year should be fully justified with cost breakup. However, no increase in EDP shall be allowed for BIO Brands of IFL and Wine.

6. All liquors to be ENA based:

IMFL manufactured locally or imported from outside the State (other than Foreign Liquor Bottled In Origin (BIO), Bottled in India or Malt Whisky) shall be ENA based only. The use of rectified spirit as a base in manufacture/ sale of Liquor for consumption in civil market and CSD/PMF shall remain banned.

7. Restriction on import of brands to protect the local industry:

There shall be a ban on import of IMFL brands having MRP up to Rs. 600/- per bottle into the union territory of J&K to protect the local industry.

8. Affixation of security hologram on IMFL, JK Special Whisky, Beer and Ready to Drink (RTD) Beverages.

In order to check Excise duty evasion, the manufacturers of IMFL, JK Special Whisky, Beer and RTD as well as Importers of IMFL/Wine/

9. Revalidation of permits:

The permit issuing authority after charging revalidation/cancellation fee of Rs. 10,000/-, may revalidate a permit which remains unexecuted or becomes time barred provided that revalidation shall be permissible only once within a period of three months from the date of Issue.

10. Renewal of licenses:

The renewal of new licenses issued by the Excise Department shall be as per the provisions of the J&K Excise Act, Smvt., 1958 and the rules framed thereunder.

11. Approval of Labels:

As provided under section 16-A of the J&K Excise Act, Samvat 1958, labels for different brands of liquor for civil/CSD/PMF for the financial year 2020-21 shall be approved within two weeks of receipt of application in the respective categories. Label fee at the rate of Rs. 50,000/- per label in case of civil and Rs. 30,000/- per label in case of CSD/PMF shall be charged at the time of applying for brand classification/MRP calculation. Labels in respect of brands which are not sold in the Union Territory of J&K and meant for export only; shall be approved without mentioning MRP subject to payment of label fee as applicable.

Provided that for BIO liquor and wine, label approval fee shall be Rs. 5000/- for each brand.

12 Packing material:

Liquor shall not be sold in plastic bottles being against the environment protection laws. All kinds of liquor will be sold in glass bottles/PET bottles and tin cans only. To ensure quality of PET bottles FSSAI standards shall be enforced. In addition to the packing sizes/liquor strength presently in vogue, the Excise Commissioner may allow Excise Bottle of any packing size and liquor of any strength as he/she may deem fit.

 - (ii) Permanent-basis: for commercial properties meant for tourist accommodation located in the water bodies in tourist areas. Permits shall be issued on charging fee of Rs. 1.0 lac for serving liquor subject to storage of maximum 24 bottle of IMFL and 24 bottles of Beer.

- (b) For registered banquets/party halls/restaurants: Rs. 0.05 lac per occasion.
- (c) For unregistered/banquet/party halls/restaurants-Rs. 0.10 lac per occasion. These unregistered premises shall be allowed a maximum of four permits per month only.

A Non-refundable fee of Rs 50000 per annum shall be charged for registration as per the procedure to be prescribed by the Excise Commissioner.

In case of any violation of the norms/license/permit conditions, action as per J&K Excise Act and rules shall be taken and registration may also be suspended/cancelled and registration fee forfeited:

Provided that the Bars located at Tourist places of Sonamarg, Gulmarg, Pahalgam and areas falling under various Tourism Development Authorities shall pay half the amount of prescribed annual license fee subject to review on yearly basis by the concerned/competent authority.

Assessment fee shall be payable on monthly basis in accordance with the prescribed procedure.

D. Additional Assessment Duty on sale of IMFL/BEER/RTD/ JK Special Whisky by licensees having -Type B, C and Dø

- - 20. **Draught Beer**: Assessment Duty on Draught Beer, to be supplied directly from the Brewery to the bars in kegs shall be levied at Breweries @ Rs.10.00 per BL. In case of import, assessment duty shall be levied at JKEL-1A/JKEL-1B as the case may be. Draught Beer in Kegs shall also be allowed to be served in parties/gatherings/social occasions for which a permit shall be issued by the competent Authority on payment of an amount equivalent to the duties applicable to Type B license in advance at the time of applying for permit.
 - 21. **Import of Liquor**: Up to two bottles of imported Duty Freeø liquor accompanied with proper invoice shall be allowed to be carried into the UT of J&K by any *bona fide* person.
 - 22. Failure to deposit the dues: The licensee shall pay simple interest @ 12% per annum in addition to 2% penalties/month as per the J&K Excise Act from the date next following the day on which any payment recoverable from him becomes due to the Government until the date on which such payment is actually made or recovered whatever may be the reason of lapse of time. The non-payment will also attract action as per the provisions of J&K Excise Act and J&K Liquor License and Sale Rules.
 - 23. Cases of fraud/violations: In order to ensure strict compliance of the Act and Rules, if any case/cases of breach of rules, provision of Act are noticed, the Excise Commissioner shall be competent to suspend/cancel the Liecnse as per the provisions of J&K Excise Act, Svt. 1958 and rules framed thereunder.
 - 24. **Social Responsibility Corpus Fund :** The long term objective of the UT is to eliminate or reduce the consumption of liquor primarily through educating the masses regarding the harmful effects of consumption of liquor.
 - Towards this end, the department shall spend money on educating people through activities like awareness campaigns,

The amount shall be deposited on monthly basis and the Department itself will contribute a matching amount and the Corpus so created shall be utilised for the following philanthropic activities :ô

- (b) Providing Ambulance service, equipment, amenities and other healthcare facilities to Hospitals;

- (d) Rehabilitation of families involved in illicit liquor trade by enabling them to take up alternate means of livelihood and their skill development.
- (e) Creation of sports infrastructure/multipurpose halls/community halls/ Libraries for encouraging the community in general and youth in particular towards positive activities.

- - 25. Typographical error(s) and inconsistencies in this document, if any shall be clarified by Excise Department/Excise Commissioner in consonance with the Act and Rules. Further, in case of any difficulty arising in giving effect to the provisions of this Policy, the Department with the approval of competent Authority may by order make such provisions including any adaptations/ modifications of provisions of this Policy.

This notification will come into force with effect from 01-09-2020.

SO-182.óóIn exercise of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Epidemic Disease Act, 1897 (Act No. 3 of 1897), the Lieutenant Governor of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir hereby makes the following regulations; namely :óó

1. **Short title, extent and commencement**.óó(i) These regulations may be called the Jammu and Kashmir Epidemic Diseases (MUCORMYCOSIS) Regulations, 2021.

- (ii) They shall extend to whole of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir.
- (iii) They shall come into force from the date of publication of the notification in the Official Gazette.
- 2. **Definitions**.óóIn these regulations unless the context otherwise requires,óó
 - (a) 'Epldemic Disease' means MUCORMYCOSIS.
 - (b) **'Surveillance Personnel'** means any personnel designated by the District Magistrate of the respective District to discharge such functions, duties and responsibilities as are considered necessary for the purpose of these regulations;
 - (c) 'Premises' means any land, whether used for agricultural or non-agricultural purposes, or any building or part of a building and includes,óó
 - (i) the garden, grounds and out-houses, if any, appurtenant to such building or part of a building, and ;
 - (ii) any fittings affixed to such building or part of a building for the more beneficial enjoyment, thereof;
 - (d) 'Order' means any instruction(s) or order(s) issued by the concerned District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate or officers of the Health and Family Welfare Department and Department of Medical Education not below the rank of Chief Medical Officer of a District, Principal of a Government Medical College or Medical Superintendent of a Hospital or any other officer of the Union territory of Jammu and Kashmir as may be designated by the Government in this regard for the surveillance, prevention and control of mucormycosis;
 - (e) 'District Surveillance Unit' means any unit or office notified as such by the Government or any of its functionaries.

- 3. All the Government and private health facilities, Medical Colleges will follow the guidelines for screening, diagnosis, management of Mucormycosis, issued by the MoHFW(GoI)/ICMR/Government of Jammu and Kashmir as amended from time to time and make it mandatory for all these facilities to report suspected and confirmed cases to Health Department through District Level Chief Medical Officers and Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP).
- 4. No person/institution or organization will spread any information or material for management of Mucormycosis without prior permission from Director, Health Services, Jammu/Kashmir.
- 5. No person/institution or organization will use any print/electronic or any other form of media for Mucormycosis without prior permission from Director, Health Services, Jammu/Kashmir.
- 6. **Notice for disobeying the Notification**.óóThe Director. Health Services, Jammu/Kashmir shall constitute a District Committee headed by Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District, which will have specialist of Internal Medicine, Ophthalmology, ENT and Epidemiologist as members to review any disobeying by the person/institution or organization of the notification or any order issued under these regulations. If disobeying is proved, a notice would be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned district against such person/institution or organization, indicating the offence/irregularly conducted as per this notification.
- 7. The reply of person/institution or organization received against the notice will be reviewed by the aforementioned District Committee. If reply is not received within stipulated time of receipt of the notice or if the reply is found unsatisfactory by the Committee and it is confirmed that the person/institution or organization has disobeyed regulations, the Chief Medical Officer of concerned district will take necessary action against the delinquent person/institution or organization as per Section 3 of the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897.
- 8. **Penalty**.óóAny person/institution or organization disobeying these Regulations or order issued under these Regulations shall be deemed to have committed as offence punishable under section 188 of Indian Penal Code (45 of 1860).

- 9. Potection to persons action under these Regulations.óóNo suit or legal proceedings shall lie against any person for anything done or intended to be done in good faith under these regulations.

SOó368.ô Whereas, on 21-05-2020, Police, Pulwama received reliable information that the HM terrorists identified as Adil Hafiz S/o Habibullah Hafiz R/o Dalipora, (2) Azad Ahmad Lone S/o Mohammad Abdullah Lone R/o Lelhaar and (3) Jehangir Ahmad Malik S/o Ali Mohammad Malik R/o Achan fired indiscriminately upon the joint naka party of Police/CRPF at Prichloo bridge; and

- 2. Whereas, during firing HC, Anoop Singh and Sg. Constable, Mohammad Ibrahim of 10th Bn IRP sustained injuries. The injured officials were shifted to hospital where HC Anoop Singh succumbed to his injuries; and
- 3. Whereas, a case FIR No. 112/2020 under sections 18, 20, 39 ULA(P) Act, 1967, was registered in Police Station, Pulwama and investigation of the case was taken up; and
- 4. Whereas, during the course of investigation, site plan of place of occurrence and statement of witnesses acquainted with the facts and circumstances of the case were recorded under the relevant provisions of law; and
- 5. Whereas, during the course of investigation it was revealed that three accused persons namely (1) Nadish Farooq Dhobi S/o Farooq Ahmad R/o Wahibugh, (2) Aqib Ahmad Bhat S/o Nisar Ahmad Bhat R/o Dalipora and (3) Umer Ismail S/o Mohammad Ismail Sheikh R/o Sirnoo were working as OGWs for the above terrorists and were providing logistic support to terrorists; and
- 6. Whereas, during the further investigation, all the three accused OGWs were arrested in connection with the case and the accused disclosed that they had provided necessary logistic support to the above terrorists and information of security forces movement in the area; and
- 7. Whereas, during the investigation the CDR analysis of the mobile phones of accused OGWs were obtained and it was revealed that the above OGWs were in constant touch with the above terrorists and on the date of occurrence i. e. 21-05-2020 the accused persons ensured safe passage to the terrorists who attacked the security forces; and
- 8. Whereas, on the basis of investigation, statement of witnesses recorded and other evidence collected, the Investigating Officer has established *prima facie* involvement of below mentioned accused persons in the commission of offences punishable under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 as shown against each accused as under :ô

Whereas, the Authority appointed by the Government under sub-section (2) of Section 45 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 has independently examined the case diary file and all the other relevant documents relating to the case and has come to the conclusion that *prima facie* case is made out against the above accused; and
- 10. Whereas, after perusing the Case Diary File, the relevant documents and also taking into consideration the views of the Authority appointed under sub-section (2) of Section 45 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the Government is of the view that there is sufficient material and evidence available against the above-mentioned accused for their prosecution under the provisions of law.

Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred by sub-section (2) of Section 45 of ULA (P) Act, 1967, the Government hereby accord sanction for launching prosecution against the above accused persons for the commission of offences punishable under sections 18, 39 of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, in the case FIR No. 112/2020 of Police Station, Pulwama.
