



at Mehand-Satkipora crossing, and during the checking, two suspects while seeing the Naka Party tried to escape but were chased down on the spot and identified as Mehraj-ud-Din Dar S/o Ab. Rashid Dar R/o Sirhama and Yasir Ahmad Bhat S/o Ahmadullah Bhat R/o Jablipora, Bijbehara. During their personal search, the Police recovered 90 AK rounds and 01 Hand Grenade from their possession respectively ; and

2. Whereas, based on the above, a case FIR No. 83/2023 under Sections 7/25 Arms Act, 3 ESA and Sections 13, 16 and 18-B of ULA (P) Act, was registered in the Police Station, Srigufwara, and the investigation of the case was set into motion. Subsequently during the investigation, the offences under Sections 3 ESA, 13, 16 and 18-B of ULA(P) Act were dropped and the Sections 4/5 ESA and 18, 20, 23, 38 and 39 of ULA(P) Act were added in the case ; and

3. Whereas, during the course of investigation, the site plan of the place of occurrence and the seizure memos were prepared and the statements of the witnesses acquainted with the facts and circumstances of the case were recorded under the relevant provisions of law ; and

4. Whereas, during the investigation, it was found that the accused viz. Mehraj-ud-Din Dar and Yasir Ahmad Bhat, were in contact with a terrorist of LeT, a banned outfit, namely, Yasir Bilal Bhat S/o Bilal Ahmad Bhat R/o Wanpoh, Kulgam, who provided the recovered AK ammunition and Hand Grenade to the accused viz. Mehraj-ud-Din Dar and Yasir Ahmad Bhat, in order to promote terrorist activities in the area ; and

5. Whereas, during the investigation, it was established that the accused viz. Mehraj-ud-Din Dar and Yasir Ahmad Bhat, were working as Over Ground Workers (OGWs) for the terrorists of LeT, a banned outfit, particularly the terrorist viz. Yasir Bilal Bhat, and were providing logistic support to them, besides, under a well knit criminal conspiracy procured ammunition and Hand Grenade from the said terrorist for carrying out the terrorist activities in the area ; and

6. Whereas, the accused terrorist viz. Yasir Bilal Bhat, has been killed in an encounter with the Security Forces and proceedings under law would abate against him ; and

7. Whereas, on the basis of the investigation, the statement of witnesses recorded and other evidence collected, the Investigating Officer, has established a *prima facie* involvement of the below mentioned accused for the commission of offences punishable under Sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, as shown against their names :

Whereas, the Authority, appointed by the Government under Sub-Section (2) of Section 45 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, has independently examined the Case Diary File and all the other relevant documents relating to the case and has come to the conclusion that a *prima facie* case is made out against the above accused ; and

9. Whereas, after perusing the Case Dairy File, the relevant documents and also taking into consideration the views of the Authority appointed under Sub-Section (2) of Section 45 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the Government is of the view that there is sufficient material and evidence available against the above mentioned accused for their prosecution under the provisions of law.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Section (2) of Section 45 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the Government hereby accord sanction for launching prosecution against the accused viz. Mehraj-ud-Din Dar and Yasir Ahmad Bhat, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections

18, 23 and 39 of ULA(P) Act, arising out of FIR No. 83/2023 of Police Station, Srigufwara.
